Permits

Residential Vehicle Annual Permit Fee:

Permit Fee \$30.00 per household (\$14.00 for second sticker), good July 1st through June 30th.

GUV District residents must get permits at their town office. Hartford residents may purchase permits at the administration building Monday-Friday and the scale house on Saturday.

A one-day pass is available for \$5 at the Administration Office.

Waste Disposal Rates

Residential Customers: One coupon or one card punch is needed to dispose of the equivalent of one large 30-gallon kitchen bag (up to 40 pounds) of trash or approximately 50 pounds of Clean Wood, tree/brush material, or bulky waste. Two coupons or punches allow disposal of one tire (16-inches or less) without its rim. Three coupons or punches allow disposal of one tire (16-inches or less) with its rim. Truck and tractor trailer tires cost one coupon or card punch per 40 pounds. Car batteries may be disposed of at a cost of one coupon per battery.

Hartford Resident Coupons: Effective November 5, 2019; \$4.00 each or \$40.00 per punch card of 10 punches. Coupons and punch cards may be purchased at the administration building Tuesday-Friday 8am-4pm and at the scale house on Saturday 8am-4pm.

GUV District Resident Coupons: Effective November 5, 2019; \$4.95 each or \$49.50 per punch card of 10, and are available at member town clerks’ offices and the Hartford Transfer Station Office.

Commercial Rates -Effective June 28, 2019 Suspending Acceptance of C&D Waste.

REGULAR RECYCLABLES	
<p>Mixed Paper (dry & loose, no bundles): magazines, catalogs, any paper envelopes, white paper, colored paper, & phonebooks, hard cover books (remove covers & spines first), notebooks/calendars (remove spiral wire to recycle as scrap metal)</p> <p>Newspaper: dry and loose</p> <p>Boxboard: cereal boxes, shoe boxes, egg cartons, wrapping paper tubes, toilet paper tubes, paper towel tubes and toy boxes. NO cartons or boxes for refrigerator (butter) or freezer (ice cream) foods.</p>	<p>Corrugated Cardboard: Cardboard & Brown paper bags. Cardboard must be dry, flattened, & cut down to 4 X 4 foot pieces & loose. NO animal feed bags with plastic liners.</p> <p>Metals: Aluminum: Beverage cans; rinsed foil, pie plates & other foil containers. Steel Cans: food cans, clean cat/dog food cans, syrup containers, cookie tins, lids from jars & cans.</p>
<p>Glass: Washed & Empty – PLEASE NOTE: BEVERAGE & FOOD GLASS ONLY –No plastic bags, No ceramic, No light bulbs, No pots, No mirrors, No Pyrex, No windshields, No windows.</p>	<p>Plastic Containers #1, #2 & #5: rinsed & empty No film or bags. No automotive, petroleum, pesticide or cleaner containers. No Rigid Plastic! No 5-Gallon Buckets</p>

Residents: When recycling please...

- ❖ Do not leave any items in the sort area. Check with staff if you have any questions.
- ❖ Use the signs and examples above the sorting tubes as a guide. Sorting in the wrong tube costs money. Please supervise your children and keep them off the rollers.
- ❖ If a tube is “closed”, do **not** remove the block- there is nothing to catch your recyclables below!
- ❖ See the pay station attendant for very large loads of any material to place in outside roll-off containers.
- ❖ Shoes must be worn at all times when on the facility grounds.
- ❖ The town is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged items.

All Facility Users: Please Note...

- ❖ Customers may enter the Construction and Demolition area at their own risk.
- ❖ All loads are required to comply with Hartford’s Solid Waste Ordinance on Waste Management and Recycling. Construction and Demolitions materials must be sorted as noted.
- ❖ All traffic, regulatory, and instructional signs must be obeyed.
- ❖ Improper dumping may result in loss of dumping privileges, monetary penalty, or other action.
- ❖ **NO** firearms, ammunition, hot ashes, liquids or hazardous materials permitted in the C&D area or the waste containers.
- ❖ **NO** recyclables permitted in the C&D area or waste containers.
- ❖ Enter and exit the scale platform at no more than 5 miles per hour. Wait for the pay station attendant’s signal before entering or exiting. Be courteous, leave enough room for other trucks to exit the scale.
- ❖ Commercial haulers must go to the pay station with all loads.

<p>Freon Devices: Refrigerators, air conditioners, etc. have a charge of \$20 per unit.</p>	<p>Shipping Peanuts and Bubble Wrap: Accepted at the Scale House Tuesday-Saturday. Available upon request for reuse.</p>
<p>Electronics: (Vermont E-Cycle): No charge for: Computers, printers & computer peripherals, televisions & computer monitors. Chargeable 1 coupon per item: MP3 players, electronic game consoles, VCR, DVD Player, Digital Converter Box, Stereo equipment, speakers.</p>	<p>Scrap Metal: Includes appliances, coat hangers, and empty, dry paint cans. Fuel tanks must be cut in half and cleaned. Barrels need tops cut off and cleaned if necessary. All scrap items must be at least 75% metal. NO liquid, paint, or compressed gas cylinders.</p>
<p>Fluorescent Bulbs: (Vermont Lamp Recycling Program): Fluorescent Tube & CFL Bulbs & Mercury Lamps Tube lights 8 feet or less in length, U-tube or Circline fluorescent lamps, & high intensity discharge (HID) lamps.</p>	<p>Architectural Paints (Recycle with Paint Care): Interior & exterior architectural paints: latex, acrylic, water-based, oil-based enamel, stains, shellacs, lacquers, varnishes, urethanes rust preventatives, field & lawn paints. Leaking or unlabeled containers must go to HHW Collection Event.</p>
<p>Automotive: Suspending Acceptance of Used Motor Oil. Will Accept at HHW Events only. Auto Batteries: There is a charge of at least one punch or coupon per car battery, depending on size. Tires: car & truck tires two coupons or punches allow disposal of one tire (21-inches or less) without its rim. Three coupons or punches allow disposal of one tire (21-inches or less) with its rim.</p>	<p>Antifreeze: Take to the Scale House attendant in see-through containers only (e.g. one-gallon milk jugs). NO mixtures. There is a cost of 1 punch or coupon per gallon.</p> <p>Bulky Waste: Includes mattresses, box springs, upholstered furniture, carpeting & padding. Check with attendant for bulky waste container location & to make sure you have appropriate waste materials. One punch or coupon for 40 pounds.</p>
ALL Yard & Lawn Materials	
<p>Yard Waste (to compost): Leaves, grass, farm animal manure only. No dog or cat waste. These wastes contain parasites and pathogens transmittable to humans. No food waste, brush, branches, or other wood.</p>	<p>Tree & Brush Material: See Scale House attendant. Maximum 4-ft lengths for logs less than 3-ft diameter, and 3-ft length for logs greater than 3-ft diameter. One punch or coupon for 50lbs.</p>
