Inclusion and ADA Accessibility Plan

Hartford Parks & Recreation actively promotes inclusive practices in order to meet the needs of participants, families, and staff in our programs. Everyone is welcome to attend Hartford programs and facilities regardless of ability, background, culture, religion, gender or economic circumstances. Through inclusive practice, we aim to reflect our wider community and promote positive attitudes to the similarities and differences in each other. In adherence to the Americans with Disabilities Act, we strive to offer reasonable accommodations to enable people with disabilities to become fully included in our programs and facilities.

Accommodations Procedures

Get Involved

There are many ways to *Get Involved*, including coaching or officiating youth sports, instructing programs or courses, volunteering for events or park labor, as well as numerous sponsorship opportunities.

General Refund Policy

If you are dissatisfied with a program after the first session/class, you must submit a written explanation to Hartford Parks & Recreation prior to the second session/class to be eligible to receive a refund. Written explanation must be sent to recreation@hartford-vt.org. In the event of an extended illness or injury, we must be notified immediately and we will issue a pro-rated refund. A medical and/or doctor explanation may be required.

Discounted amusement park tickets, discounted ski/snowboard tickets, one day programs, community events that involve ticket sales, and bus trips are non-refundable.

An effort will be made to schedule a make-up date if a class/program/game is canceled due to any causes beyond our control. If this is not possible, no partial refund will be provided.

Refunds will be applied as a Household credit unless otherwise requested. Processed refund requests, other than a Household Credit, will be charged a \$5.00 cancellation fee. This does not apply to our Camp Ventures Cancellation/Refund Policy (see below).

Camp Ventures Cancellation/Refund Policy (Updated)

If you decide to cancel a week of Camp Ventures, a written explanation must be emailed to recreation@hartford-vt.org. Camp Ventures cancellations will be assessed a \$25 fee per session. To be eligible for a refund or credit, cancellations must be made by June 15, 2023. No refunds or credits will be issued on cancellations made after June 15, 2023.

Full refunds (less credit card convenience fees, if applicable), will be issued for programs cancelled or altered by the Hartford Parks & Recreation Department.

Credit/Debit Card Convenience Fees: Applicable credit/debit card **convenience fees** are non-refundable.

Refunds may take three to four weeks to process. No cash refunds.

Parent or guardian signature is required for youth 17 and under.

REGISTER EARLY! Many programs fill quickly. Program cancellation could occur if our minimum enrollment numbers have not been met.

Registration Guidelines (Continued)

REGISTRATION DEADLINE: We must meet our minimum enrollment number one week prior to the start date of programs. If we have not met the minimum by the deadline, the program may be cancelled. If we have met the minimum, we will continue open enrollment until the program is filled or the class begins.

Please be aware that program information, location, instructors and/or fees could be subject to change. Some circumstances may be beyond our control.

Mail-in registration payments must be received at least **four days prior** to program start date.

Program fees are payable at the time of registration (cash, check or credit/debit card). You can register online with a credit or debit card at hartfordrec.com.

We provide equal opportunity to anyone who would like to participate in our programs.

If you require special accommodations, please contact the Hartford Parks & Recreation Office prior to the program's starting date.

RESIDENTS are those who **reside** in the Villages of Hartford, Quechee, West Hartford, White River Junction, or Wilder.

Team Athletic Registration Information

Registrations for team athletic programs will be accepted on an on-going basis until the registration deadline. It is crucial that participants register prior to the registration deadline. The number of teams, coaches, equipment and schedules are determined by the pre-registration numbers.

Any registration request made after the registration deadline will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Consideration to accept participants after the registration deadline will depend on the number of available coaches, team sizes, playing spaces, equipment and uniforms/shirts. See each individual program to view the deadline details.
