AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HEMPSTEAD, TEXAS, AMENDING THE CITY OF HEMPSTEAD CODE OF ORDINANCES BY GRANTING A SPECIFIC USE PERMIT TO ALLOW THE CONSTRUCTION OF A CHURCH TO BE USED AT BLOCK 180, LOTS 4-5 LOCATED IN THE R1- SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY IN AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,000 FOR EACH DAY THE VIOLATION EXISTS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND REPEAL OF ANY ORDINANCE IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

WHEREAS, the Owner of Block 180, Lots 4-5 has made application to the City to approve a Specific Use Permit to allow the construction of a church in the R1-Single Family Residential District; and

<u>Section 5.</u> That all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict, hereby repealed.

Section 6. That it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this ordinance is passed was open to the public as required by law, and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required.


