4. Consideration and action on minutes of July 17, 2023, August 7, 2023, and August 10, 2023, meetings.

Councilmember Nora Hodges made a motion to approve the minutes. Councilmember Mildred Jefferson seconded the motion and carried it unanimously.

13. Consideration and action from Waller County Fair Association for Hotel/Motel funds in the amount of \$5,000 for advertising.

Councilmember Mildred Jefferson made a motion to approve Hotel/Motel funds to the Waller County Fair Association. Councilmember Nora Hodges seconded the motion and carried it unanimously.

5. Consideration and action on a Resolution from the City Council of the City of Hempstead adopting land use assumptions, a capital improvements plan, and impact

fees for water and wastewater facilities in accordance with Chapter 395 of the Texas Local Government Code; making certain findings related to subject; and providing for severability.

Jared Engelke with Strand and Associates, the city's engineer presented a PowerPoint to council on impact fees that the city can charge for new developments. The CIAC can implement the fees immediately and assess them to the city's ETJ. Impact fees are in line with other surrounding cities. Councilmember Mildred Jefferson asked when will the impact fees go into effect. Jared Engelke answered that the city council can set the date to commence. Councilmember Lonnie Garfield agreed with the impact fees. Councilmember Cindy Pearce asked if this will also be subject to residential? Jared Engelke answered only if the property is to be re-plated.

Mayor Pro-Tem Lonnie Garfield made a motion to approve the Resolution of Impact fees with a starting cost of \$6,967 to include the city's ETJ effective immediately. Councilmember Mildred Jefferson seconded the motion and carried unanimously.

Ben Cohen stated that their goal is to have it by March 31, of every year but it doesn't always happen that way, with adjustments to the trial balance, gathering information, and a backlog of the pandemic. Ben Cohen stated that we are staying in line, we just have to continue to follow the path. Finance Officer Alan Younts stated that overall, it's a good audit, the city has such a small tax base as revenue, inflation, winter storm and the pandemic it affects a small city like us. Continue to work hard and keep in line with the budget.

Kollye Kilpatrick stated that a kiosk will be set up at city hall for the citizens as well. Councilmember Nora Hodges stated that the information on the customer portal was included in the last two newsletters.

11. Discussion on City of Hempstead's Personnel Travel Policy.

Councilmember Nora Hodges asked the council if anyone had any questions about the travel policy. Since the wrong information was stated, Councilmember Nora Hodges read the travel policy so council could have a clearer understanding. Councilmember Nora Hodges added the general statement which included all personnel (elected officials and employees) to a policy previously written by Manager of Operations Kollye Kilpatrick, that only included directors and employees. He stated that what concerned him was the deficit is much higher. Last year the utility fund had a surplus, but its lower this year. Councilmember Cindy Pearce only approved of the raises and step program for the Police Department, for Scott Duncan, and for

Blake Duncan and Eric Kilpatrick due to their promoted positions. She stated no one disputes their dedication, but the city is at a 28% poverty rate. She appreciates all the employees.

Councilmember Nora Hodges also stated she appreciated all employees and will decide on salaries based on a balanced budget and comparison of salaries with that of other cities similar to our population. Councilmember Mildred Jefferson stated that everyone deserves a raise. Councilmember Karon Neal stated that she appreciates all employees and all their hard work. Mayor Pro-Tem Lonnie Garfield stated he appreciated all employees.

ORDINANCE NO. 23-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HEMPSTEAD, TEXAS PROVIDING FOR THE ASSESSMENT, LEVY, AND COLLECTION OF AD VALOREM TAXES FOR THE 2023 TAX YEAR AND FOR EACH YEAR THEREAFTER UNTIL OTHERWISE PROVIDED; PROVIDING THE DATE ON WHICH SUCH TAXES SHALL BE DUE AND PAYABLE; PROVIDING FOR PENALTY AND INTEREST ON ALL TAXES NOT TIMELY PAID; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

WHEREAS, Section 26.05 of the Texas Tax Code provides that by September 30th or the 60th day after the date the certified appraisal roll is received by the taxing unit, the governing body of each taxing unit shall adopt a tax rate for the current tax year; and

WHEREAS, Section 26.05 of the Texas Tax Code further provides that where the tax rate consists of two components (one which will impose the amount of taxes needed to pay the City's debt service and the other which will impose the amount of taxes needed to fund maintenance and operation expenditures of the City for the next fiscal year), each of such two components must be approved separately; and

WHEREAS, the proposed tax rate for the current tax year of the City of Hempstead, Texas, consists of two such components, a tax rate of \$0.075027 on each \$100.00 of assessed valuation for debt service and a tax rate of \$0.507658 on each \$100.00 of assessed valuation to fund maintenance and operation expenditures; and

WHEREAS, by separate motions heretofore adopted by the City Council of the City of Hempstead, Texas, at a meeting of said City Council held on the 18th day of September 2023, said City Council have approved separately the tax rate heretofore specified for each of said components; and

WHEREAS, having thus separately approved the tax rate for each of such components, it is necessary and appropriate for the City Council to now formally pass, approve, and adopt a 2023 tax rate ordinance for the City of Hempstead, Texas; and

WHEREAS, all notices and hearings required by law as a prerequisite to the passage, approval, and adoption of said tax rate ordinance have been timely and properly given and held; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HEMPSTEAD, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The facts and recitations set forth in the preamble of this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted, ratified, confirmed and incorporated herein for all purposes.

<u>Section 2</u>. All property including real, personal, and mixed subject to ad valorem taxation by the City of Hempstead, Texas, shall be equally and uniformly assessed for such purposes at One Hundred Percent (100%) of the fair market value of such property.

Section 3. For the purpose of paying the interest on bonds, warrants, certificates of obligation, or other lawfully authorized evidence of indebtedness issued by the City of Hempstead, Texas, including the various installments of principal due on the serial bonds, warrants, certificates of obligation, or other lawfully authorized evidence of indebtedness issued by the City as such installments shall respectively mature, and for the purpose of paying any sums borrowed in anticipation of current revenues for use in the payment of bonds and certificates of obligation and interest thereon maturing in the fiscal year 2023-2024, and for the purpose of repaying interest and making provisions for the sinking fund on such other bond issues, warrants, certificates of obligation, or other lawfully authorized evidence of indebtedness as may be authorized, there is hereby levied for the year 2023 and for each year thereafter until otherwise provided, to be assessed and collected upon all property described in Section 2 of this Ordinance, an ad valorem tax at the rate of \$0.582685 on each \$100.00 of assessed valuation for debt service.

Section 4. There is hereby levied for general purposes and use by the City of Hempstead, Texas, for the year 2023-2024, and for each year thereafter until otherwise provided, an ad valorem tax at the rate of \$0.582685 on each \$100.00 of assessed valuation on all property described in Section 2 of this Ordinance. The proceeds from such tax shall be applied to the payment of the general and current expenses, also known as maintenance and operations, of the government of the City. All such taxes shall be assessed and collected in current money of the United States of America.

THIS TAX RATE WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE.

THE TAX RATE WILL EFFECTIVELY BE RAISED BY

Section 5. All ad valorem taxes levied hereby, in the total amount of \$0.582685 on each \$100.00 of assessed valuation, as reflected by Sections 3 and 4 hereof, shall be due and payable

on or before January 31, 2024. All ad valorem taxes due the City of Hempstead, Texas, and not paid on or before January 31st following the year for which they were levied shall bear penalty and interest as prescribed in the Texas Tax Code.

Section 6. In the event any clause, phrase, provision, sentence, or part of this Ordinance or the application of the same to any person or circumstance shall for any reason be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect, impair, or invalidate this Ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part declared to be invalid or unconstitutional; and the City Council of the City of Hempstead, Texas, declares that it would have passed each and every part of the same notwithstanding the omission of any such part thus declared to be invalid or unconstitutional, whether there be one or more parts.

<u>Section 7</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict, hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HEMPSTEAD, TEXAS PROVIDING THAT THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HEMPSTEAD BE AMENDED BY AMENDING THE ZONING MAP SO THAT PROPERTY DESCRIBED AS CLEAR CREEK DEVELOPMENT LOT 1, ACRES 25.132 SHALL BE CHANGED FROM AR-AGRICULTURAL RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT CLASSIFICATION AND BECOME AND BE DESIGNATED AS HC – HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL DISTRICT CLASSIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; AND FINDING AND DETERMINING THAT THE MEETING AT WHICH THIS ORDINANCE IS PASSED IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AS REQUIRED BY LAW.

WHEREAS, the Owner of a tract of land has made application to the City to designate the zoning classification of said tract of land, same being more particularly described as Clear Creek Development Lot 1 Acres 25.132 to HC – Highway Commercial District; and

Section 1. The facts and matters set forth in the preamble of this Ordinance are hereby found to be true and correct and are incorporated herein for all purposes.

<u>Section 2</u>. That pursuant to the Code of Ordinances of the City of Hempstead, Texas, the zoning map is amended as follows: **CLEAR CREEK DEVELOPMENT LOT 1 ACRES 25.132** which is currently zoned **AR**, shall be changed to be designated and classified as **HC** Zoning district and the Zoning Map shall be amended accordingly.

- <u>Section 3.</u> That a violation of this ordinance shall be a Class C misdemeanor and the penalty for violating this Ordinance shall be a maximum fine of \$2,000.00, and each day a violation exists shall be a separate offense.
- <u>Section 4.</u> That if any provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of such ordinance shall continue in full force and affect the same as if such invalid or unconstitutional provision had never been a part hereof.
- <u>Section 5</u>. That it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance is passed is open to the public as required by law, and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required.










Electric 10 Year Forecast Primary Assumptions













Gas 10 Year Forecast Primary Assumptions





Gas Cost of Service TY 2023








