





Staffing

Ongoing Update on Number of Children in Placement

Last month we had 16 children in our care in out of home placements. We have 16 children in care this month compared to 15 last year for the same month. Teams are meeting regularly to identify permanent options for these children including reunification with their families with services. Kanabec County is not alone in this issue. We are up slightly over last year for the same month.

Potential Change in Chemical Health

Kanabec County's Chemical Health Assessor is looking to move with her family. This would give the Agency an opportunity to change how Chemical Health assessments are performed. The State is moving outside county assessments for Chemical Health funding. There are providers who could complete assessments for the County on a contracted basis. We would develop an internal process for billing treatment and reviewing placement practices.

If the Board decides to explore this option we could contract for these duties on a per assessment basis at a far less cost than having a staff person completing them.

Option two would be to try and hire a social worker with the necessary training and experience in chemical dependency to do the assessments. The number of persons available to perform this job is limited and with changes at the State they will be in great demand, making finding an assessor and retaining them difficult.

If you decide to go with option one we can change to hiring our own assessor at any time. Another benefit of contracting for these duties is it would also give us a chance to make sure the Aging Services Care Coordinator is the most cost effective option and billing projections are correct to cover that position.

Financial Assistance

A. Major Highlights

- Jennifer Ollestad has completed all of her DHS trainings.
- Our staff handled the month of December well. December involves cost-of-living-adjustment (COLA) work for all cases that have income such as Social Security.
- Things have been working well with our new CMJTS Employment Specialist.

B. Challenges/Concerns

- We have had difficulties with the state helpdesk that deals with MNsure (METS) related technical requests. There are times when we have to send tickets to have something done to a case that we are unable to do. We've had issues with getting responses back that don't resolve the issue. This continues to be a challenge.
- Potential legislative changes to the SNAP program. We may have additional administrative requirements coming down to us regarding abled-bodied SNAP participants.

C. Looking Ahead

- Jennifer continues to develop her skills as an eligibility worker and continues to do well.

Child Support

A. Major Highlights

- We had a number of staff attend the MFSRC conference. It was a great learning experience.
- We developed a plan to adjust caseloads for January 2020. This will allow Tammy to be more of a resource for our team and open up availability to CSOs when they need it. Tammy will also have more of an opportunity to explore ways to improve our performance.

B. Challenges/Concerns

- We did not meet the required minimum performance target for the ‘percent of current child support paid’ measure. The minimum target was 75.37%. Our percentage was 74.74%. We are required to complete a performance improvement plan (PIP). We would have met this measure if we collected about \$13,747.00 more in current support.
 - We have submitted our PIP, but have yet to hear back if our plan has been accepted.
- We have a new child support magistrate and we are getting used to how she processes cases through her court.
 - We did meet with the magistrate this quarter

C. Looking Ahead

- We will be engaging in efforts to improve our performance following our PIP.

Children’s Mental Health

A. Major Highlights:

- Youth entered residential treatment.
- Another youth continued in Voluntary placement.
- We continue doing respite group activities which have gone really well.

B. Trainings:

- Alissa and Linda attended St. Louis County Health and Human Services Conference and attended a variety of trainings.
- Alissa attended Mental Health First Aid Certification Course.

C. Challenges/Concerns:

- We are still struggling to get required assessment instruments (Child and Adolescent Service Intensity Instrument and Strengths and Difficulties Questionnaire) from therapists.
- Increase in intakes cause caseloads to be higher again.
- Traditional respite options are lacking in our area.
- Long waitlists for in home skills and therapy at this time.

D. Looking Ahead:

- Planning more group activities, camps, and other things with respite funds.
- Wait lists for residential spots continue to increase as some of those facilities close units and reorganize.
- Making plans to manage increasing caseloads.

Child Protection

Kanabec County Family Services Fourth Quarter 2019 Report

A. Major Highlights:

- CFS received blankets for all children in foster care from Fostering Families and distributed these to families in December.
- CFS received Christmas gifts for all children in foster care from Safe Haven that were distributed to children in December.
- On November 25 & 26, KCFS assisted the financial department with the distribution of Thanksgiving dinners to families.
- On October 17 Child Protection staff participated in Operation Community Connect as volunteers.
- Child Protection staff participated as volunteers for the Toys for Tots distribution by wrapping, shopping, sorting and assisting clients.
- Family Services has partnered with NorthStar Family Advocacy Center to conduct forensic interviews and provide resources to our families. NorthStar Family Advocacy Center is in Braham. In this quarter two interviews were completed at NorthStar. .
- The agency continues to utilize the Ticket's for Kids programs for families and have been able to give tickets out for Twins Games, the Science Museum, Monster Jam, MN Wild games, the Trampoline Park, Jurassic Quest, Valley Fair and a Taylor Swift concert.

B. Trainings:

- Kari attended Foundations Training in October and December.
- Kristen and Tamara attended St. Louis County Conference in October.
- Jen attended SISS Mentor Training and MSSA Police Summit in November.

- Leah and Sharon attended Mental Health First Aid in December.
- Sharon, Kristen, Tamara, Jen, Kari and Leah attended Josh Dye's Authentic Persuasion training at the December All Building Meeting.
- Kari, Katie, Sharon, Kristen, Jen, Tamara and Leah attended Collaborative Safety Training in October.
- Staff has been taking advantage of the offerings from the partnership with Convene Webinar's.

C. Challenges/Concerns:

- Truancy cases and attendance issues as the school year continues.
- Limited resources and waiting lists present a challenge to address the needs of clients.
- Chronic chemical use/abuse in the county and its exposure children.

D. Looking Ahead:

- Anticipation for an increase in cases of truancy and attendance now that the students have been in school.
- Welcoming Katie back from leave and being fully staffed.
- DHS will be updating some to the Child Protection Guidelines in January of 2020.

A. Major Highlights

- **CUA's (Chemical Use Assessments) = 44**

*Some clients have been opened and closed prior to these counts, those would be persons on medical insurance, or those who have gone on a health plan after being assessed. Some clients also require multiple levels of care which leads to higher numbers of placements occurring.

- Monthly webex with DHS regarding Rule 25 and new system updates

C. Challenges and Concerns –

- DHS continues to make system changes prior to having informed all affected parties ex. Institute of Medical Disease (IMD) edits which always ran through financial workers at the county, are to be sent to DHS to have the corrections made. However, facilities apparently are not aware of this and continue to send the status reports to the county, they then are given to this worker and a financial worker, who now have to send them to DHS rather than just having the financial worker making the change. Financial Dept. and I have worked it out so that I will forward the IMD status reports to DHS so we are not duplicating the process

DD Case Management Adult Protection Vulnerable Adult

A. Major Highlights

- The Account Validation Service (AVS) form sent out by DHS, has caused some clients to come very close to losing their MA and Waivers.

B. Training Attended

- One staff attended the St. Louis Conference in Duluth

C. Challenges and Concerns

- A lack of resources overall for children in the area, including in-home therapies, resources for children with autism.
- Concerns raised by family members regarding parental fees for children on Waivers.
- There continues to be a need for PCAs in the area, which makes it difficult trying to get or maintain PCA presence in a home.
- Finding adequate, adult corporate foster care housing, in the Kanabec County area, that is handicap accessible.

D. Looking Ahead

- Continuing to find resources in our area, or places who will service our area.

E. Trends

- An increase in the need for home modifications for clients with special needs.
- Increase in the use of Technology for Home and UCP to assist with communication and sensory needs.

- There has been more proactive service seeking and service use by people in crisis.

Community Support Program

A. Major Highlights

- Offered seasonally appropriate gatherings to increase social skills and build community. Many do not have family in the area and the only celebration they attend is the gathering held here. Coping skills for the holiday season were a focus.

B. Training Attended

- I continue to complete research and training as needed to offer the best and most effective treatment to those I serve.

C. Challenges and Concerns

- Many people have not been awarded their fuel assistance grant for this heating season. This is leading to financial stress of trying to pay all their regular bills as well as heating bills on their limited fixed budgets.

D. Looking Ahead

- Tax season is next big stressor for people. Most will get a refund. We will encourage budgeting funds to decrease anxiety in the future.

E. Trends

- A benefit of healthy diet is being explored on many levels in the mental health field.







RE: GIS Map and Data Pricing

There currently isn't any protocol relating to the sharing of county maps and GIS data. Counties throughout the state have policies in place, but vary in how data is handled. The Environmental Services office has found that there is a need to adopt a policy regarding county mapping and GIS data sharing.

Many counties currently have costs associated with printing hard copy maps. The cost helps to cover paper, ink, and time costs. A proposed cost table for purchasing hard copy maps is shown in the proposed policy below.

The GIS data that the county houses and uses is occasionally requested for use by outside sources. In the past, the data has been sent to the requestor without any charge or conditions. The county currently has a fee schedule in place to obtain data from the Assessor's Office. The GIS data does not include this information, but could be used in conjunction with it. Other counties have adopted a fee schedule associated with sending over the information, while others have found it more economical to keep their data open and available to anyone for use. Other counties have also adopted separate license agreements that requestors must submit prior to obtaining any GIS data. It is recommended that the County Board move to adopt a policy pertaining to the sharing of our GIS data. A sample policy is attached.

Kanabec County GIS Data Sharing Policy

1. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to establish guidelines for the sharing of county GIS data, regardless of format, with an outside party. The policy is intended to comply with Minnesota statutes relating to the sharing of data. Any statute references refer to the 2019 statute version adopted on September 17th, 2019. Any changes to statutes after this date do not impact this policy.

2. Applicability

The policy applies to any data that is contained with the Kanabec County GIS system, any data requests received by Kanabec County, the use of any data obtained from Kanabec County, and any GIS services performed by the county.

3. Definitions

Government data. "Government data" means all data collected, created, received, maintained or disseminated by any government entity regardless of its physical form, storage media or conditions of use (MN Statute 13.02, Subd. 7).

Government entity. "Government entity" means a state agency, statewide system, or political subdivision (MN Statute 13.02, Subd. 7a).

Political subdivision. "Political subdivision" means any county, statutory or home rule charter city, school district, special district, any town exercising powers under chapter 368 and located in the metropolitan area, as defined in MN Statute section 473.121, subdivision 2, and any board, commission, district or authority created pursuant to law, local ordinance or charter provision. It includes any nonprofit corporation which is a community action agency organized pursuant to the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964 (Public Law 88-452) as amended, to qualify for public funds, or any nonprofit social service agency which performs services under contract to a government entity, to the extent that the nonprofit social service agency or nonprofit corporation collects, stores, disseminates, and uses data on individuals because of a contractual relationship with a government entity (MN Statute 13.02, Subd. 11).

Public data. All government data collected, created, received, maintained or disseminated by a government entity shall be public unless classified by statute, or temporary classification pursuant to MN Statute section 13.06, or federal law, as nonpublic or protected nonpublic, or with respect to data on individuals, as private or confidential. The responsible authority in every government entity shall keep records containing government data in such an arrangement and condition as to make them easily accessible for convenient use. Photographic, photostatic, microphotographic, or microfilmed records shall be considered as accessible for convenient use regardless of the size of such records (MN Statute 13.03, Subd. 1).

4. Data Sharing

Sharing of data shall only be conducted between the county and the requestor.

The requestor shall not use the GIS data on behalf of any other individual, organization, corporation, or any other third party, and shall not duplicate or disclose the GIS data to any third parties unless such use, duplication or disclosure is expressly authorized in writing by the county. Pursuant to MN Statute 16E.30, electronic geospatial government data will be shared at no cost with government entities. Any other party can obtain the county's data at a cost specified in the Kanabec County GIS Fee Schedule document. Any data shared by the county shall be sent "as is" and any requests for further attribute data can be approved or denied by the county.

5. Payment

Any requestor of data or services shall follow the Kanabec County GIS Fee Schedule. If government entities request a hard copy map or GIS services, they become subject to the fee schedule. The county maintains the right to adjust the fee schedule as needed over time. Any fees shall be paid prior to release of any data.

6. Agreement

The county and the requestor shall hold copies of a signed and approved GIS Data Use Agreement. By signing the agreement, the requestor is agreeing to follow the Kanabec County GIS Data Sharing Policy.

7. Disclaimer

The data available from Kanabec County is provided "as is" without warranty or any representation of accuracy, timeliness or completeness. The burden for determining accuracy, completeness, timeliness, merchantability and fitness for or the appropriateness for use rests solely on the requestor accessing this information. Kanabec County makes no warranties, expressed or implied, as to the use of the data available. There are no implied warranties of merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose. The user acknowledges and accepts all inherent limitations of the data, including the fact that the data is dynamic and in a constant state of maintenance, correction and revision.

8. Governance

All GIS data is handled by the Kanabec County Environmental Services Office.



Lease Agreement

This Agreement (“Agreement”) between the County of Kanabec, Minnesota (“County”) and Nemeth Orthodontics (“Lessee”) is effective January 1, 2020.

The term of this Agreement shall be one (1) year, beginning on January 1, 2020 and ending on December 31, 2020, unless earlier terminated as provided herein.

The leased space is owned by the County and is located at 18 North Vine St, Meeting Rooms #3, 4, 5 and the basement entry area, Mora, MN 55051. The leased space is described as office space for the purpose of business, is approximately 1024 square feet, and is reserved for use from 7:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on the second Friday of the month.

Lessee shall pay rent in the amount of **\$105.00** per month, due on or before the first of each month. The check shall be made payable to the Kanabec County Auditor/Treasurer and delivered to the Kanabec County Coordinator at 18 N. Vine Street, Suite 181, Mora, MN 55051.

The County shall furnish and pay for all utilities not including telephone service. The County will provide telephone service under separate agreement.

Lessee agrees to carry insurance for its property located in the leased space, and is solely responsible for securing and maintaining its own insurance.

Each party agrees that it will be responsible for its own actions and the results thereof to the extent authorized by law and shall not be responsible for the acts of the other party or the results thereof. The County’s liability is governed by the provisions of Minn. Stat. Chap. 466 and other applicable laws.

Any and all employees of Lessee shall be considered employees of Lessee only, and not of the County, and that any and all claims that may or might arise under the Workers’ Compensation Act of the State of Minnesota on behalf of said employees while so engaged and any and all claims made by any third parties as a consequence of any act or omission on the part of said employees which so engaged on any of the work or services provided to be rendered herein shall be the sole obligation and responsibility of Lessee.

The Lessee will pay for any damages or alterations done to premises. Any alterations to the leased space must be pre-approved and in writing before starting. Premises and fixtures shall be in as good a condition as when tenant took possession except for normal wear. Lessees shall keep grounds and premises clean and free of all trash and litter.


How does the BVP relate to Boundary and Annexation Survey (BAS)?

The BVP is conducted every (10) years to provide TCs and HEOs the opportunity to review the boundary data collected during the BAS. The program is administered in two phases (Initial BVP and Final BVP) and runs in parallel with the 2020 BAS. TCs and HEOs will receive BVP materials approximately (2) weeks after the BAS contact receives the 2020 BAS annual response e-mail or letter. This provides TCs and HEOs an opportunity to review their legal boundary to verify or provide corrections prior to the 2020 Census. If boundary corrections are required, TCs and HEOs are instructed to work with their BAS contact to provide updates through the 2020 BAS.

How does the BVP benefit you?

This data is the base for ongoing programs such as the American Community Survey and Population Estimates Program. Government agencies and other groups use this tabulated data to allocate \$675 billion of government funds to communities across the country. Legal boundary data is also made publicly available and is used by federal agencies, researchers, and the public.



What is the Boundary and Annexation Survey (BAS)?

Every year, the Census Bureau conducts the BAS to collect information about selected legally defined geographic areas. The BAS invites governments to report official name changes, (dis) incorporations, and (de) annexations. Governments can also update boundaries, features, and landmarks for:

- Federally recognized tribes with reservations or off-reservation trust lands.
- Cities, towns, boroughs, and villages (incorporated places).
- Townships and towns (minor civil divisions).
- Counties (or county equivalents).
- Consolidated cities.
- Roads and other applicable features.

How to participate?

The BVP is conducted in two phases, [Initial BVP](#) and [Final BVP](#). During each of these phases, TCs and HEOs are instructed to work with their BAS contact to review and update their government's boundary, name, and status information. TCs and HEOs do not need to register to participate in BVP. The materials will be provided automatically.

Initial BVP

The Initial BVP materials include an Initial BVP letter, form, and paper maps or a CD/DVD containing PDF maps. The maps should reflect the legal boundary for the government effective on January 1, 2020. TCs and HEOs are instructed to review the Census Bureau's depiction of the legal boundary for accuracy and to return the completed Initial BVP form by March 1, 2020.

If the information is correct, no further action is required.

If any information is incorrect, TCs and HEOs should work with their BAS contact to submit corrections through the 2020 BAS. If boundary updates are submitted to the BAS by March 1, 2020, TCs and HEOs will have an additional opportunity to verify their government's boundary prior to final data tabulation for the 2020 Census. Changes received after March 1, 2020 will be used to correct the boundary, but there will not be sufficient time to send updated maps before final data tabulations for the 2020 Census.

Final BVP

The Final BVP provides an opportunity for TCs and HEOs to review recent boundary updates provided through the 2020 BAS. Only governments that reported corrections to the 2020 BAS on or before March 1, 2020 will receive Final BVP materials. The Final BVP materials include a Final BVP letter, form, and a paper map or map index sheet. The maps should reflect the legal boundary for the government effective on January 1, 2020. TCs and HEOs are instructed to review the Census Bureau's depiction of the legal boundary for accuracy and to return the completed Final BVP within five (5) business days.

If the boundary is correct, no further action is required.

If any information is incorrect, TCs and HEOs should work with their BAS contact to submit corrections, within five (5) business days of receipt of materials.

Responding with boundary updates is easy.

The Census Bureau provides multiple free, user-friendly methods for the BAS contact to report boundary corrections through participation in BAS.

Schedule

- January 1, 2020—Legal boundary updates must be in effect on or before this date to be included in the 2020 Census.
- January 2020—BAS and Initial BVP materials will be mailed.
- March 1, 2020—Boundary updates submitted by this date will receive Final BVP materials to provide governments an opportunity to confirm that the correct legal boundary is used for 2020 Census data tabulations.
- May 31, 2020—Boundary updates sent by this date will be reflected in the 2020 Census.
- June 2020—Final BVP materials will be mailed. Participants have until July 2020 to respond with updates or approval of the legal boundaries.



Boundary and Annexation Survey (BAS)

BAS Overview

Every year, the U.S. Census Bureau conducts the BAS to collect information about selected legally defined geographic areas. The BAS provides tribal, state, and local governments an opportunity to review the Census Bureau's boundary data to ensure the Census Bureau has the correct legal boundary, name, and status information.

During the BAS, governments can report legal boundary changes, such as incorporations, disincorporations, annexations, and deannexations. Governments can also update boundaries, features, and landmarks for:

- Cities, towns, boroughs, and villages (incorporated places).
- Townships and towns (minor civil divisions).
- Counties (or county equivalents).
- Consolidated cities.
- Roads and other applicable features.



Benefits of BAS Participation

The Census Bureau uses legal boundaries collected through the BAS to tabulate data for the decennial census.

Responding to the BAS ensures that tribal, state, and local governments have the most accurate boundary data available for the tabulation of decennial census housing and population counts. This data is the base for ongoing programs such as the American Community Survey and Population Estimates Program. Government agencies and other groups use this tabulated data to allocate more than \$675 billion in federal funding to communities across the country. Legal boundary data is also made publicly available and is used by federal agencies, researchers, and the public. Participation in the BAS ensures that governments receive the funds for which they are entitled and have the best data available for decision-making processes.




