STATEMENT OF EVIDENCE

ORIGINAL POST SET BY DEPUTY SURVEYOR SILAS BARNARD ON SEPTEMBER 13, 1849 AND 2 BIRCH TREES WERE NOTED AS BEARING TREES. NO VISIBLE EVIDENCE OF THE POST OR BEARING TREES REMAINS TODAY.

IN BOOK 2 OF SURVEYS, PAGE 23, JOHN NELSON RECORDED A SURVEY FOR THE NW 1/4 OF SEC. 31, T39, R.24. JOHN DOESN'T SHOW WHAT WAS AT THIS CORNER BUT CHAINAGE IS SHOWN BOTH TO THE NE CORNER AND NW CORNER OF SEC. 6. JOHN MEASURED 40.18 CHAINS (2651.88 FT.) FROM THE N 1/4 CORNER OF SEC. 6 TO THE NE CORNER AND TODAY WE MEASURED 2650.74 FT. TO AN OLD CORNER POST AT THIS LOCATION.

HAND EXCAVATION WAS DONE AROUND THE OLD CORNER POST BUT NO ADDITIONAL EVIDENCE COULD BE FOUND.

WE ACCEPTED THIS FENCE CORNER AS THE BEST EVIDENCE FOR THE PERPETUATION OF THIS CORNER AND SET AN KANABEC COUNTY MONUMENT ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE CORNER POST, TOOK TIES AND ESTABLISHED KANABEC COUNTY COORDINATES ON THIS POSITION..
