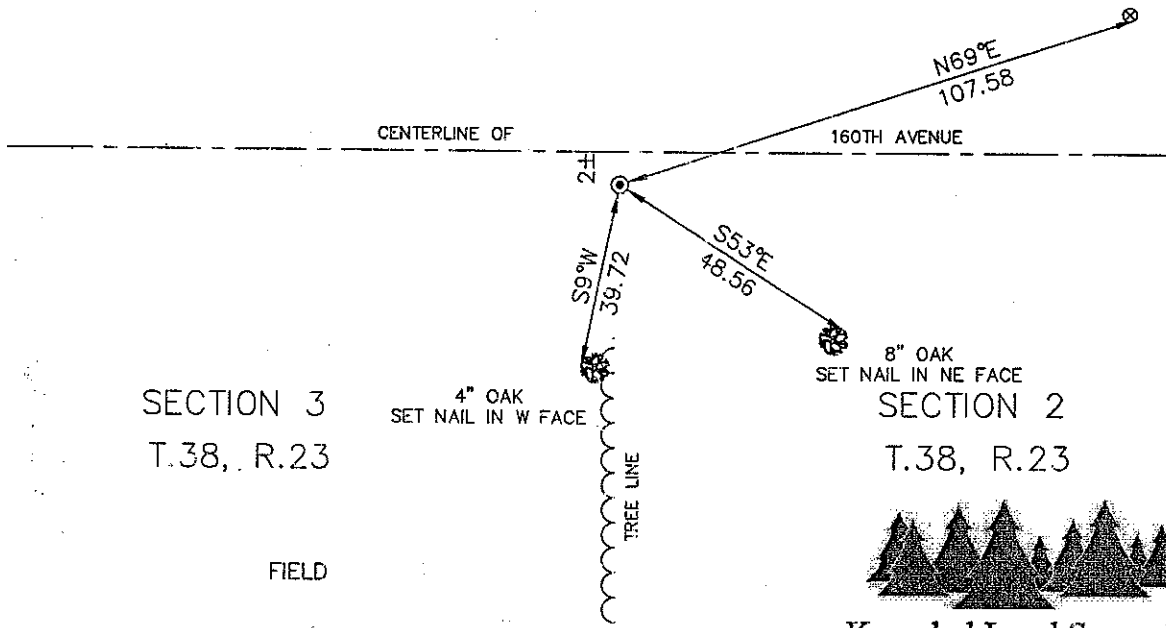

Statement of Evidence:

In September of 1849, Deputy Surveyor John Smith set a post to mark the Northeast Corner of Section 3, Township 38 North, Range 23 West, 4th Principal Meridian.

Reference ties were taken to:

- 12 inch Sugar at North 28 degrees West a distance of 30 links
- 14 inch Aspen at North 75 degrees East a distance of 13 links
- 15 inch Aspen at South 41 degrees East a distance of 26 links
- 16 inch Aspen at South 55 degrees West a distance of 12 links

All of the original Government corner evidence was searched for. None was found.

1900—Surveyor Thomas Vickery made a survey along the south and west lines of Section 35, T.39, R.23, per the records of the Kanabec County Highway Department. He does not state anything found or set at the Southwest corner of Section 35.

Surveyor Thomas Vickery records a map of the Township line along the north line of Section 3, T.38, R.23, per the records of the Kanabec County Highway Department. He does not state any distance nor anything found or set at the Northeast corner of Section 3. There is no date on this map.

1911—County Surveyor John Nelson made a survey around Section 2, T.38, R.23. He states the Northwest corner of Section 2 being a corner formerly established. He does not state what type of monument he found.

In October 2012, I made a survey around Section 34, Township 39 North, Range 23 West, 4th Principal Meridian for Christie Hershberger to locate existing monuments, lines of occupation and establish search areas.

On 10/18/2012, we made a 12' x 15' x 2.5' excavation with a front end loader at the center of the road and a field edge running south. We found a 1.75" x 1.3' solid Iron Pin with orange paint on it. No other evidence was found in the excavation. It appears the road had been cut in this area. The found Iron Pin fits the occupation lines north and south of this corner. I set a 1/2" x 24" Iron Pipe with Aluminum Cap in place of the found Iron Pin. Established reference ties and assigned Kanabec County coordinates.

This location was determined to be the best available evidence of the original government corner.



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
