

STATEMENT OF EVIDENCE
(FROM TIE SHEET 886) (1995)

All of the original government bearing trees are now gone.

There is a survey on file at the County Recorder's Office in Section 3 by John Nelson, County Surveyor, dated 1911. This survey record shows a sandstone, marked with a "+", at the sixteenth corners and quarter corner on the section line between Sections 3 and 4.

In June of 1994, we ran a survey along the east line of Section 4, and searched for the sandstone set by Nelson, but could not find any evidence of it.

Nelson's distance from the line was 5388.24 feet and our measurement from the center line intersection at the southeast corner of Section 4 to the monument at the northeast corner is 5382.4 feet.

We found evidence of an old fence corner at the east quarter corner and testimony from the land owner in the Northeast Quarter of Section 4 that his father had set the fence corner at the sandstone location.

We accepted the fence corner as the perpetuated location of Nelson's corner. Nelson's distance to the northeast corner of Section 4 was 2730.42 feet and ours measured at 2724.15 feet.

(2003)

In October 2003, we did a survey around Section 2 and Section 3 and found this monument. We established Kanabec County coordinates on the corner using G.P.S. equipment.
