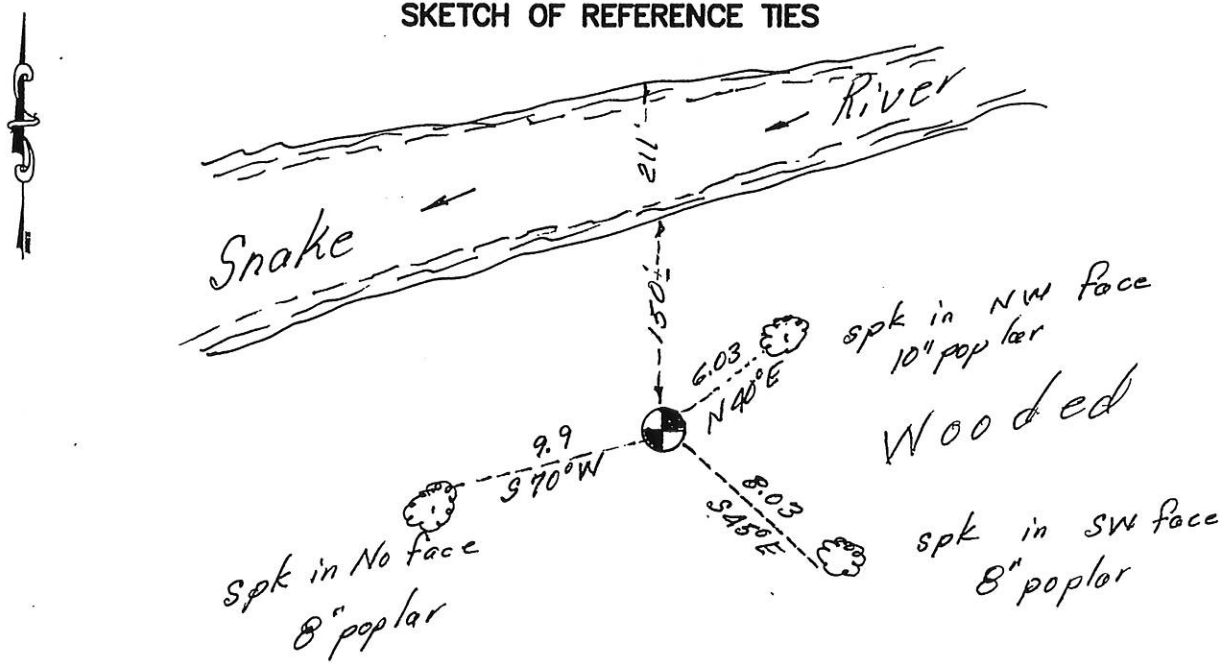

The original Government post was set by U.S. Deputy Surveyor in November, 1849 and 4 bearing trees noted as being;

10" Balsam bearing South 10° West at 38 Links

8" Elm bearing North 45° West at 6 Links

7" Balsam bearing North 60° East at 35 Links

8" Balsam bearing South 8° East at 17 Links

No evidence for post or bearing trees could be found.

This corner falls in a heavily wooded area with no occupation lines in the vicinity. It is approximately 150 feet south of the Snake River. No records of subsequent surveys could be found at Kanabec County Offices or the D.N. R. Therefore we considered this to be a last corner and set it on line and equidistant from the Northeast corner of Section 13 to the Northeast corner of Section 25. A #7 x 24" rebar with an aluminum cap was set, ties were taken and Kanabec County Coordinates established on this position.
