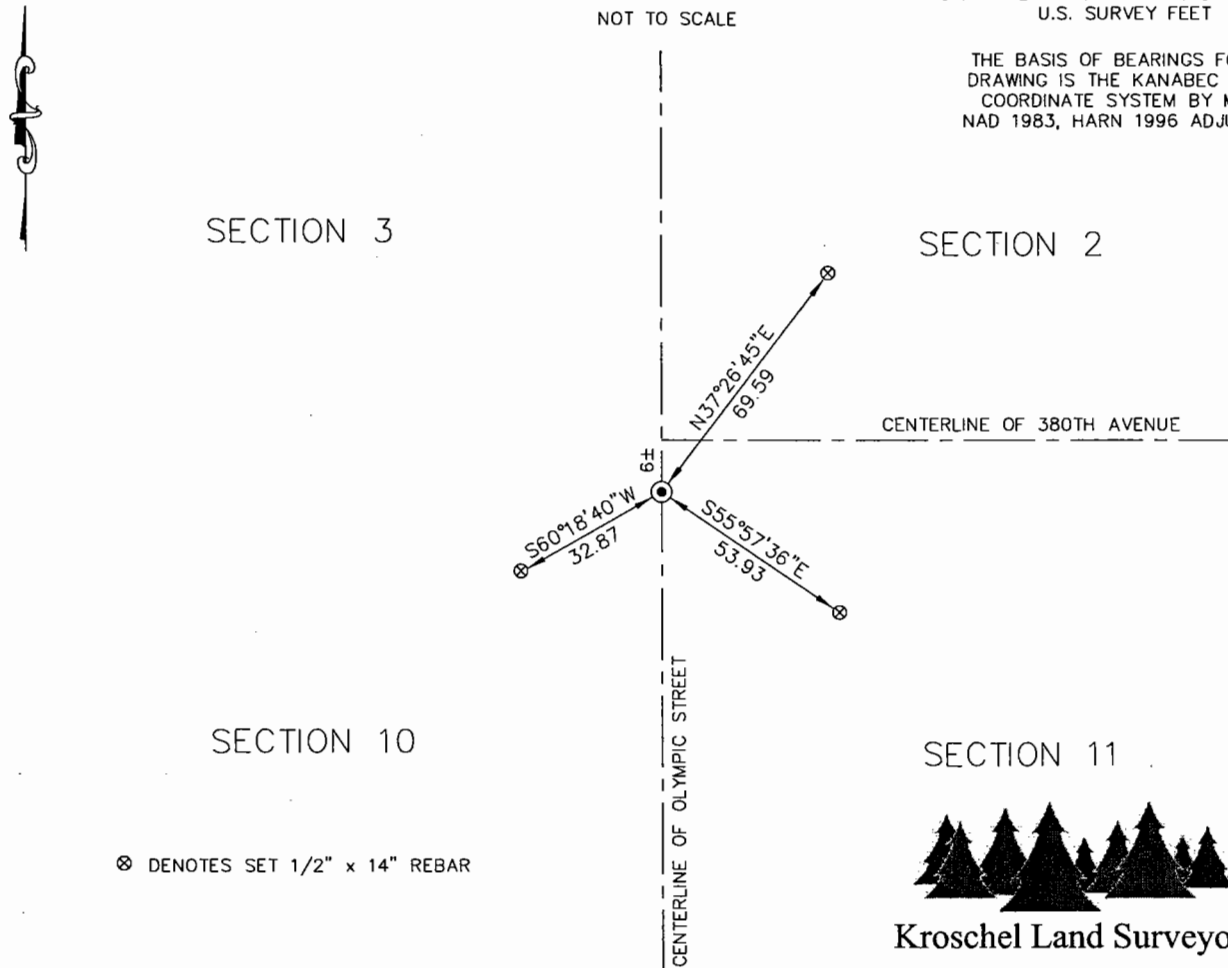

Statement of Evidence:

In October of 1851, Deputy Surveyor John Gay set a post to mark the Northeast Corner of Section 10, Township 42 North, Range 23 West, 4th Principal Meridian.

Reference ties were taken to:

20 inch Pine at North 13 degrees East a distance of 15 links

8 inch Balsam at South 16 degrees East a distance of 27 links

All of the original Government corner evidence was searched for. None was found.

1908— Surveyor T.B. Vickery filed a survey in Book 1 of 2 of Surveys, Page 46 for a Road survey for the Town of Peace. Vickery mentions a plat of the road found on Page 316, which shows a U.S. Witness found at the Northeast corner of Section 10 and a distance of 80.00 chains along the East line of Section 10.

1911— A Supervisor's Road Order was filed in the Office of the County Auditor opening a road along the east line of Section 10 and the north line of Section 11. Surveyor T.B. Vickery made a survey of the road and measured a distance of 80.00 chains along the east line of Section 10 and a distance of 82.00 chains along the north line of Section 11. Vickery does not indicate what type of monument was found/set at the Northeast corner of Section 10.

1922— A Supervisor's Road Order was filed in the Office of the County Auditor opening a road along the south, west and north lines of Section 10. Surveyor Geo Jenks made a survey of the road and measured a distance of 5280 feet along the north line of Section 10. Jenks indicates a Pump Head was in place at the Northeast corner of Section 10.

1974— County Surveyor M. B. Rude made a traverse around Sections 3 through 10 for a survey located in Section 6. Rude located the centerline intersection of roads for an approximate corner at the Northeast corner of Section 10, which he used for proportioning to establish the Southeast corner of Section 6.

In November 2022, the Kanabec County Highway Department made an excavation with a backhoe at the Northeast corner of Section 10, Township 42 North, Range 23 West, 4th Principal Meridian.

On 11/28/2022 we made a 12' x 16' x 2.5' deep excavation search at the centerline intersection of Township Roads. At a depth of 0.7 feet we found a 1/2" Iron Pipe. At a depth of 1.5 feet we found a spike, in approximately the same position as the 1/2" Iron Pipe. At a depth of 2 feet we found a Well Pump Head. The found Well Pump Head was approximately 3 feet south of the found 1/2" Iron Pipe and Spike. No other evidence was found in the excavation.

On 2/13/2023 I set a 1/2" x 14" Rebar with Plastic Cap marked KROSCHER 44490 in place of the found Well Pump Head. This location was determined to be the best available evidence of the original corner location. Established reference ties and assigned Kanabec County Coordinates.



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
