



EAST QUARTER CORNER SECTION 29, T42, R24

**STATEMENT OF EVIDENCE**

THE ORIGINAL CORNER POST WAS SET BY DEPUTY SURVEYOR ISAAC BANKER ON DECEMBER 13, 1855 AND A SUGAR MAPLE AND WHITE PINE WERE USED AS BEARING TREES - NO VISIBLE EVIDENCE REMAINS FOR THE CORNER OR BEARING TREE.

NO SUBSEQUENT SURVEYS COULD BE FOUND THAT USED THIS CORNER AT THE KANABEC COUNTY OFFICES.

THERE IS A ROAD OPENING ALONG THE EAST SIDE OF SECTION 29, DATED 7-10-1914 FILED IN KANABEC COUNTY AUDITORS OFFICE. IN OCTOBER 2006 E.G. RUD AND SONS INC. DID A SURVEY AROUND SECTIONS 19-21 AND 27-34. THIS CORNER FALLS ON THE CENTERLINE OF A NORTH-SOUTH TRAIL WITH NO OCCUPATION LINES RUNNING EAST-WEST.

A #7 REBAR WITH AN ALUMINUM CAP WAS SET ON THE CENTERLINE OF TRAIL AND AT A PROPORTIONATE DISTANCE BETWEEN THE NORTHEAST AND SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 29. REFERENCE TIES WERE TAKEN AND KANABEC COUNTY COORDINATES ESTABLISHED ON THIS POSITION.
