**STATEMENT OF EVIDENCE**

**THE ORIGINAL CORNER WAS ON DECEMBER 26, 1855 BY DEPUTY SURVEYOR ISAAC BANKER AND 2 BEARING TREES NOTED AS:**

**7" ASPEN @ 19 LINKS BEARING N17°E**

**9" ASPEN @ 37 LINKS BEARING S67°W**

**NO VISIBLE EVIDENCE COULD BE FOUND FOR THE ORIGINAL CORNER OR BEARING TREES.**

**NO RECORDS OF ANY SUBSEQUENT SURVEYS COULD BE FOUND AT THE KANABEC COUNTY OFFICES.**

**IN DECEMBER 2011 E.G. RUD AND SONS SURVEYED AROUND SECS. 1, 2, 11, AND 12. THIS CORNER FALLS IN A NORTH-SOUTH ROAD AND ONLY OCCUPATION LINES BEING A FENCE RUNNING EAST 200± FEET NORTH OF A LINE BETWEEN THE NE AND NW CORNERS OF SEC. 14.**

**WE SET A #7 REBAR WITH AN ALUMINUM CAP EQUIDISTANT BETWEEN THE NE AND NW CORNERS OF SEC. 14. THIS FELL 9± FEET EAST OF THE CENTERLINE OF THE ROAD. TIES WERE TAKEN AND KANABEC COUNTY COORDINATES WERE ESTABLISHED ON THIS POSITION.**
