

STATEMENT OF EVIDENCE

THE ORIGINAL CORNER WAS SET AND TIES TAKEN BY GOVERNMENT SURVEYOR JOHN M. GLEY IN SEPTEMBER 1851. THERE IS NO REMAINING EVIDENCE FOR THIS CORNER OR BEARING TREES.

IN OCTOBER 2005 E.G. RUD RAN A SURVEY AROUND SECTION 21 TO LOCATE EXISTING MONUMENTATION AND LINES OF OCCUPATION.

THIS CORNER FALLS ON THE CENTERLINE OF A NORTH-SOUTH GRAVEL ROAD AND AN OLD FENCE LINE RUNS EAST AND A TREE ROW RUNS WEST

WE DID NOT MAKE AN EXCAVATION AT THIS LOCATION BECAUSE THE COUNTY HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT HAD JUST INSTALLED A NEW CULVERT JUST NORTH OF THIS LOCATION.

WE ACCEPTED THE OCCUPATION LINES AS THE BEST EVIDENCE FOR THE PERPETUATION OF THIS CORNER. THIS POSITION FITS WITHIN 1.5 FEET OF A PROPORTIONAL DISTANCE BETWEEN THE NOTHEAST AND SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 21.

WE SET A A #7 REBAR 24 INCHES LONG WITH AN ALUMINUM CAP AND ESTABLISHED KANABEC COUNTY COORDINATES ON THIS CORNER USING G.P.S. EQUIPMENT.
