


Mission:

Women, Infants and Children (WIC)

Supplemental food and nutrition program funded by the Federal Government. Studies show that WIC participation reduces fetal and infant death, the birth of low weight babies, and iron-deficiency anemia.

Family Case Management

Assures easier access to medical care and provides referrals to available support services for pregnant women, mothers and infants.

Lead Poisoning Prevention

Provides testing for children and inspects the dwellings of children who exhibit elevated blood lead levels. These inspections include an environment lead inspector as well as a trained public health lead nurse, for education and followup of elevated lead levels.

Potable Water Program

Aims to reduce the risk of contraction & transmission of waterborne diseases; with an emphasis on protecting water quality of community, non-community & private wells.

Onsite Wastewater Disposal

Protects the health of community & the environment by ensuring the proper disposal of domestic sewage.

West Nile Virus Surveillance:

In an effort to monitor the spread of West Nile virus, Knox County Health Department, in collaboration with the Illinois Department of Public Health, tests mosquitoes and dead birds in Knox County for possible infestation.

• In Summer 2011, 41 total samples were collected averaging 47 mosquitoes per sample; none were positive for West Nile virus.





Public Health Emergency Preparedness

Emergency preparedness focuses on maintaining and improving the ability of Knox County to respond to a public health emergency through collaboration with community organizations.

Communicable Disease Surveillance & Investigation

Works to protect the health and welfare of Knox County residents through the control of infectious diseases. In partnership with the state health department and local health care providers, Health Department staff identify, investigate and try to control disease outbreaks in our community.

Immunizations

Staff provide immunizations to infants, children and adults at minimal or no cost to protect Knox County residents from vaccine-preventable diseases. Flu and pneumonia vaccines are also available.

Community Health Education

Staff work to enhance the overall health and well-being of Knox County residents through the provision of community health education programs, the collection and assessment of health and demographic data, community health improvement planning, social marketing and health promotion activities.

Break the Habit Program

The Health Department, in collaboration with the American Lung Association and Illinois Department of Public Health Tobacco Free Communities Grant, offers the "Break The Habit" program. This proactive quit smoking approach integrates offering free cessation aids along with the Illinois Tobacco Quitline counseling services.

Draw the Line/Respect the Line

6th, 7th, & 8th graders at Abingdon Middle School participated for the second consecutive year in the Draw the Line/Respect the Line program. Curriculum helps students develop and practice healthy relationship limits.

Community Gardening

The Knox County Health Department firmly believes that healthy eating is a key to good health. In 2011 health department staff started a community garden on health department grounds. The garden produced tomatoes, zucchini, cabbage, lettuce, carrots, spinach, squash and green beans which were shared among clients and staff.

Strategic Health Concerns

Health Care Access

One in ten (10.5%) Knox County adults lacks health insurance coverage; and 9.3% of adults do not have a regular health care provider according to 2007 BRFS data.

Mental Health

Based on 2007 BRFS data, one in five (19.1%) Knox County adults experienced poor mental health extending a week or more in the past month, higher than any of the three previous survey years and significantly above the state at 12.1%.

Sexual Behavior

Knox County rates of Chlamydia were 230 cases in 2007, an 18-year high. Ever since 2004, the county's annual number of cases has exceeded 200; and teen mothers (females under age 20) in Knox County gave birth to 77 infants in 2008, accounting for 14.1% of all births.



Obesity, Nutrition, & Diabetes

Adult obesity rates have doubled nationally in the past 30 years; youth rates have tripled; and 67.9 % (two in three) Knox County adults are considered overweight (35.7%) or obese(32.2%), according to 2007 BRFS data.

Oral Health

One in four (25%) Knox County adults ages 18 years and older report not having seen a dentist in the past two years.

Knox County Community Health Center (KCCHC)

Our mission is to provide access to dental and primary health services, for the medically underserved, which stresses prevention and patient responsibility.

Medical Health Care Statistics...

- 1,579 patients received health care during 3,141 visits;
- 62% of patients were female & 38% were male;
- Approximately 1% Asian, 5% Hispanic, 15% African American, and 76% Caucasian;
- 30% are Medicaid and 70% self-pay; top reasons for doctors visit, include: physical exam, female annual exams, STD testing, diabetes, mental health.

Dental Health Care Statistics...

- 5,125 patients received dental care during 2011;
- 90% were 20 years of age or younger;
- Services : 3,332 cleanings & 3,719 exams; 1,608 fillings & 838 extractions;
- Preventative care services increased in 2011, oral exams 50%; cleanings 7.5%;
- Over 90% of all patients receive Medicaid or Allkids
