### **Vaccines Offered**

- Moderna, Pfizer and initial vaccination series, boosters
  - **Moderna** vaccines are available to those 18 years of age and up
  - **Pfizer Primary Series** is available to those 5 years of age and up
  - **Pfizer Boosters** are available for adolescents 5 and up

## **COVID-19 Vaccine Booster Shots**

### **If you received Pfizer**

Everyone ages 5 and older **should get a Pfizer booster at least 5 months** after completing their initial Pfizer vaccination series. Individuals aged 5-17 years old can get a Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine booster. Adults 18 years and older can get either Pfizer or Moderna as a booster dose.

### **If you received Moderna**

Everyone ages 18 and older **should get a booster at least 5 months** after completing their initial Moderna vaccination series. Adults 18 years and older can get either Pfizer or Moderna as a booster dose.

### **If you received Janssen (J&J)**

Everyone ages 18 and older should receive a booster dose at least 2 months after receiving their Janssen/J&J COVID-19 vaccine. The CDC prefers either of the mRNA vaccines (**Pfizer or Moderna**) as a booster dose. (**The Knox County Health Department does not currently have J&J available**)

### **2<sup>nd</sup> Booster Shot – What You Should Know:**

Individuals 12 years and older who are moderately or severely immunocompromised and adults 50 years and older who are not moderately or severely immunocompromised may choose to receive a second booster of Moderna or Pfizer 4 months after their first booster dose.

### **Accessing Vaccine Records**

If you need a copy of your vaccine record you can access it through IDPH's immunization portal, Vax Verify. Vax Verify now includes SMART™ Health Card, an easy way to share your COVID-19 vaccination status. The SMART™ Health Card allows users to download a QR code which individuals can use to confirm their COVID-19 vaccination status.

## Get Vaccinated and Stay Up To Date

Being Up to Date on your vaccines means a person has received all recommended COVID-19 vaccines, including any booster dose(s) when eligible.

Fully vaccinated means a person has received their primary series of COVID-19 vaccines.

You are up to date with your COVID-19 vaccines when you have followed the current recommendations listed below. The recommendations will be different depending on your age, health status, and when you first got vaccinated.

Teens 12-17 should only get a Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine booster	Everyone ages 18+ should get a booster dose of either Pfizer BioNTech or Moderna (mRNA COVID-19 vaccines) at least 5 months after the last does in their primary series.	Everyone ages 18+ should get a booster does of either Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna (mRNA COVID-19 vaccines) at lease 2 months after the first does of Janssen (J&J) COVID-19 vaccine.
