
BEGINNING IN THE EARLY 1700S, THIS AREA HAS ATTRACTED A MULTITUDE

- The mill was created as a log structure circa 1720 as part of a 1,000 acre property that became known as Abbeyville.
- The mill provided a means for commercial processing of agricultural products, causing the formation of a substantial road for the Westward Expansion.
- transportation within the County in the late 1800s and 1st half of the 20th century. They created West End Park initially to increase the number of ticket-purchasing riders.

The mill became a bath house for changing clothes and renting bathing suits.

Maple trees were growing quickly.

Sand was trucked in to create a perimeter beach.

Water was drawn out of the Little Conestoga Creek, filtered, and circulated into the pool.
