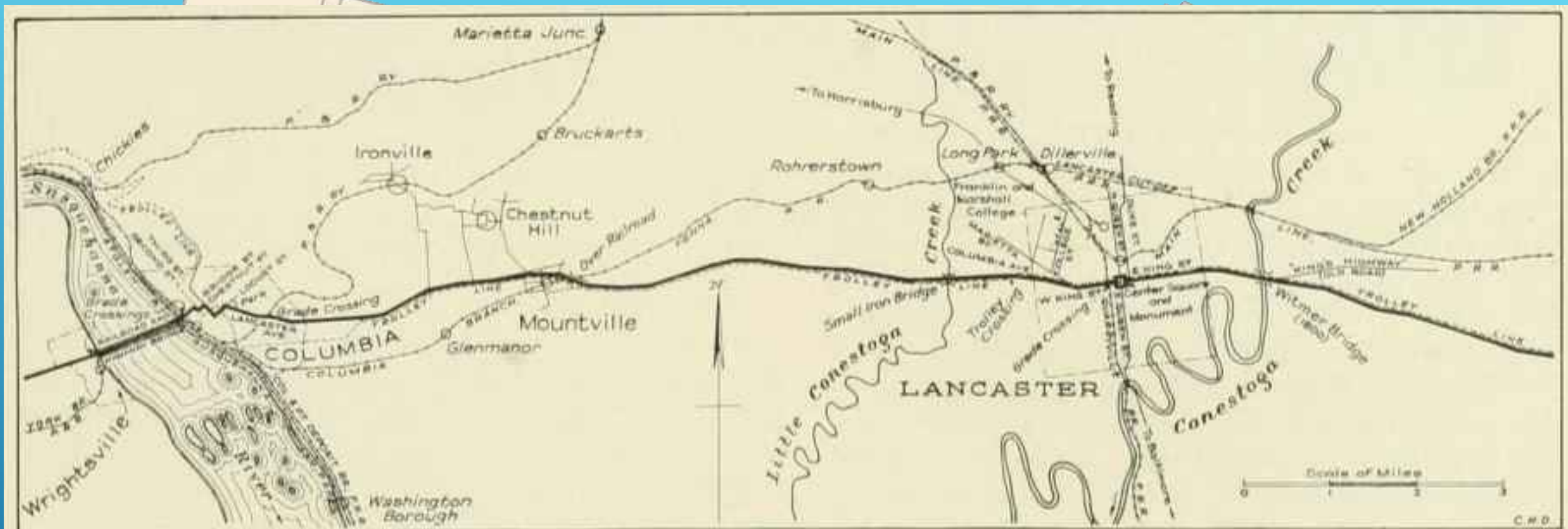


LANCASTER TOWNSHIP *RE-TELLING OUR HISTORY*

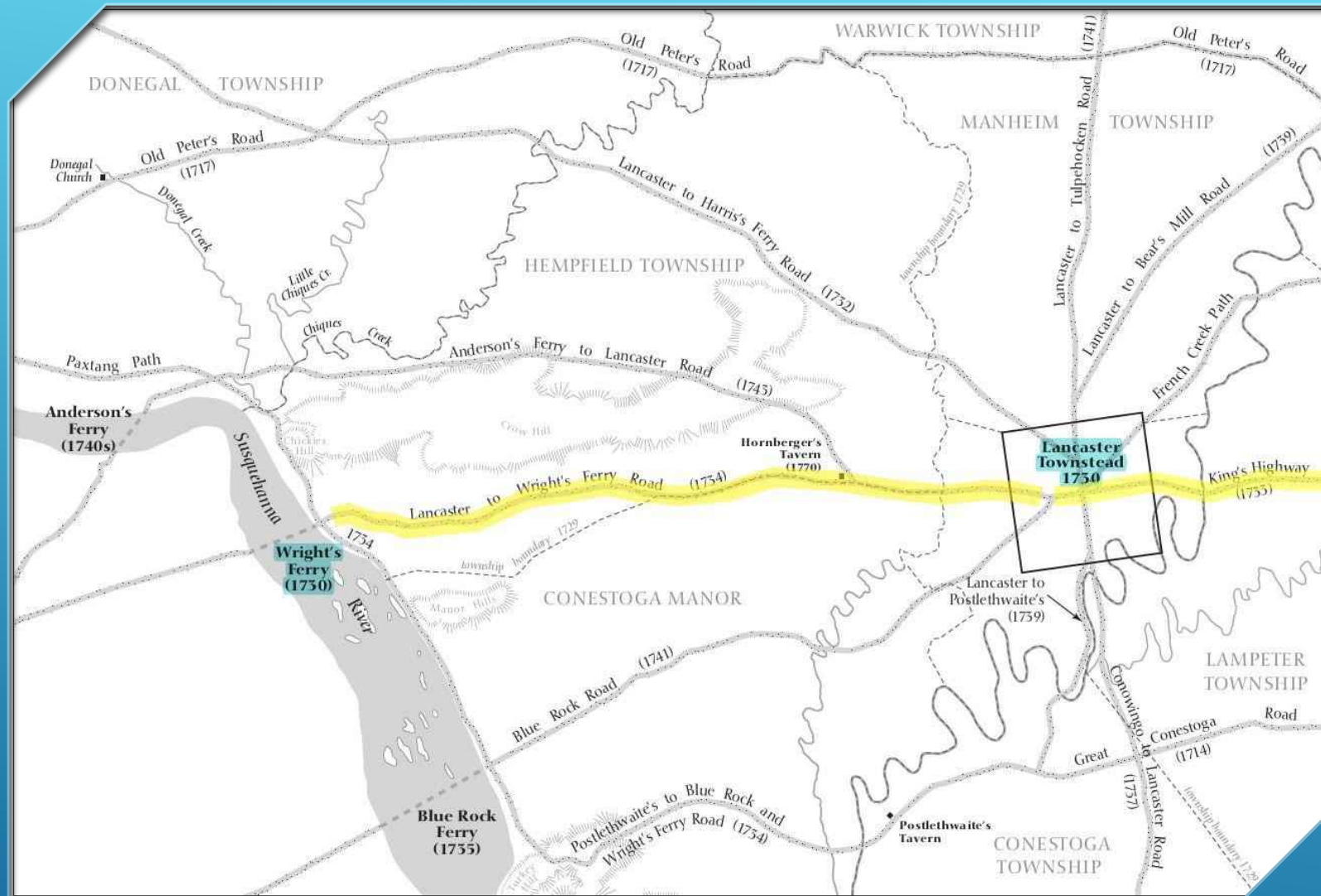
Lincoln Highway through Lancaster Township

THROUGH LANCASTER, TO AND ACROSS THE SUSQUEHANNA AT COLUMBIA
 No. 12 reading from West to East, or No. 5 reading from East to West

Known today as US Route 30, this first Transcontinental Highway ran right through the center of Lancaster.

- Head up the hill

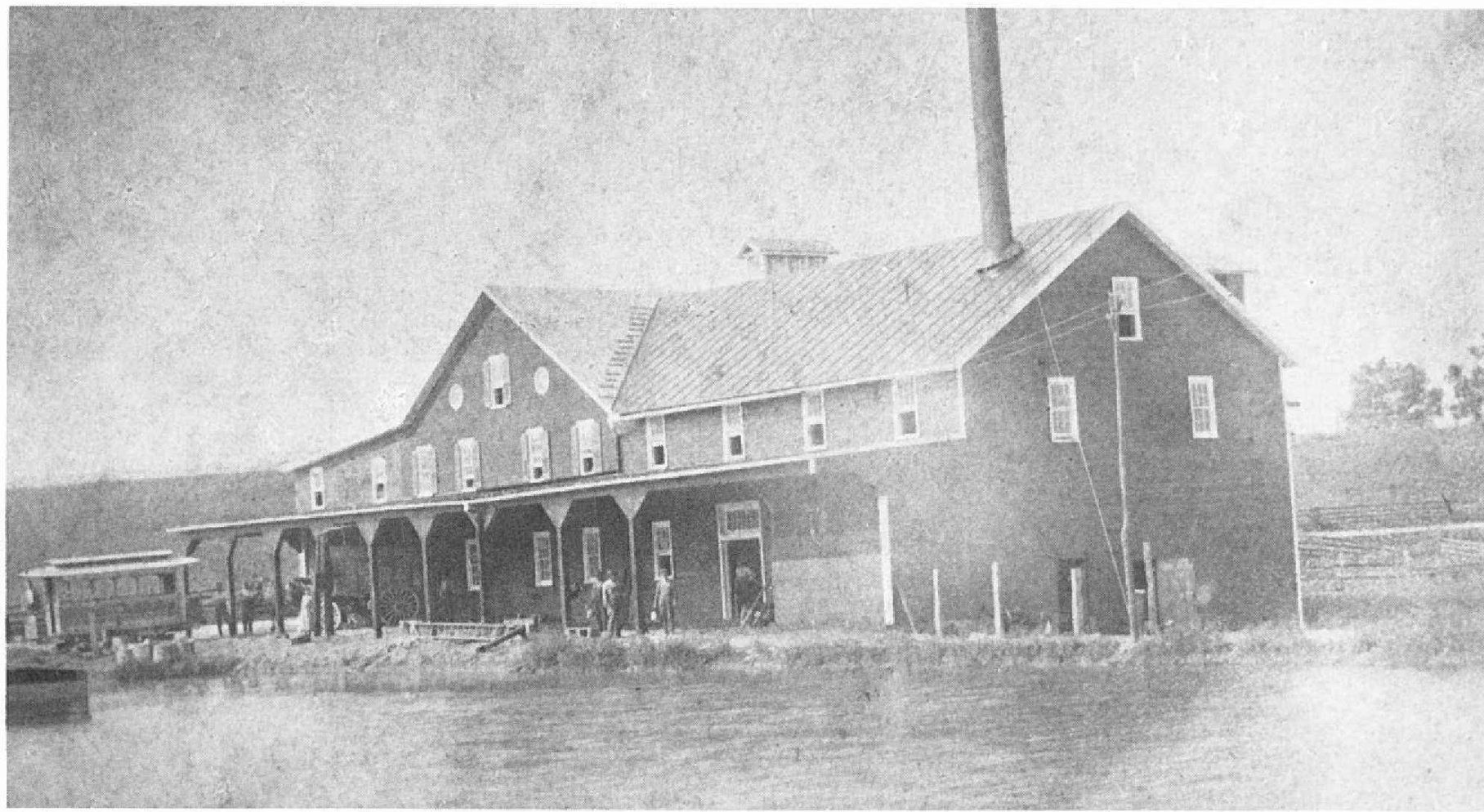
THE HILL WAS TOO
