MAYOR'S MEMO

Greetings Lathrup Village Residents,

My hope is that this newsletter finds you and your family well.

I am not sure about you but I have been very excited about the progress that is happening in the city. I know that it may be inconvenient driving around but just think about how much easier it will be to drive on our newly reconstructed streets! Construction started on May 3rd and will continue in phases until 2023.

The State of Michigan Lead & Copper Rules require cities to verify the water line material where it enters the home and connects to the water meter. So far we have identified 21 homes that have lead water lines. The 21 affected residents have been contacted and the replacement process of those lines will begin this summer. There is no charge to the resident to replace the service lines. We are still urging residents to do a self-identifying inspection of their water service line material within their homes. It takes about 3 minutes to do and does not require any technical expertise. Please visit the city's website under the "News" section for more information. The QR code link is also on the back cover of this newsletter.

The city's Planning Commission has reviewed zoning and general code language related to recreational cannabis. The next step in the process is to hold a public hearing to receive comments from residents, business owners and property owners of Lathrup Village. This is scheduled for Tuesday, June 15 at 7 PM during the regular Planning Commission meeting. Information will be on display in the Community Room at City Hall until June 7 in an exhibit hall format. I strongly encourage residents to provide feedback (whether you are for or against recreational cannabis) through comment cards at City Hall, on our online survey, by emailing the City Clerk at cityclerk@lathrupvillage.org or by sending me a email at kgarrett@lathrupvillage.org. FROM YOUR TREASURER

Summer tax bills will be mailed around July 1. If you have made changes to your escrow company, please notify us at (248) 557-2600 ext 227 to make sure your tax bill is mailed to the correct place. Please note the following important dates:

- You have until August 31, 2021 to pay your 2021 summer taxes without penalty with the city.
- September 1, 2021 a 4% penalty shall be added for late payment. On the first day of October and of each succeeding month an additional ½ of 1% shall be added.


INFRASTRUCTURE

UPCOMING INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS AND UPDATES

The City of Lathrup Village bonded \$5.38 million needed for the public infrastructure improvements. Work has already started. The following projects will continue over the next 3 years – replacement of water mains, water meters, gate valves, fire hydrants, water service line verifications and replacements, sanitary sewer, retention tank improvements, and replacement of force mains and lateral sewer lines, as well as sidewalk, ditch, and drainage improvements.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN 2021

- Install 11 fire hydrants in new locations
- Replace or refurbish 45 existing fire hydrants
- · Some homes in the area may temporarily experience rust-colored water.
- Install 8 gate valves (these isolate water for the repair of water mains) in new locations



Replace or refurbish 67 existing gate valves



WATER SERVICE LINE MATERIAL VERIFICATION and REPLACEMENT- New State mandates requires the City to identify the material of a statistically significant number of unknown water service pipes leading into homes and businesses. Any service line that consists of a lead or galvanized steel is required to be replaced with the cost born completely by the City. Approximately 500 verifications will occur per year and will include the replacement of Stop Boxes.

WATER METER REPLACEMENTS - The water meter stock in Lathrup Village is dated and most have outlived their expected life. A request for proposal will be issued for new water meters with real-time reporting of usage.

WATER MAIN REPLACEMENTS - Wiltshire and San Rosa water mains will be replaced this summer.

SANITARY SEWER REPAIRS - Repairs to sewer lines will occur based upon this year's sewer line inspections.

SANITARY RETENTION TANK - The "Tank" is part of the Evergreen Farmington Sanitary Sewage District, which has recently become a Chapter 20 Drainage District. To increase capacity, prevent frequent spills and basement backups, and address the Corrective Action Plan (CAP) under the Administrative Consent Order (ACO), the Tank requires significant upgrades and expansion of its capacity.

STREET REPAVING PROJECT 2021 – This project began in May and is scheduled to continue through the summer. Parts of the following streets will undergo paving activities: Alhambra, Avilla, Cambridge, Glenwood West, Santa Barbara South, Santa Barbara North, San Jose, Sunset, Sunnybrook, and Wiltshire. Additional projects include jet cleaning of culverts and installation of culvert extensions.

SIDEWALK REPLACEMENT PROGRAM- Many residents have noticed their sidewalks have been marked. The city has initiated a Sidewalk Replacement Program. While the property owner is responsible for the costs of the repair/replacement, the city has contracted to have work done. Work is anticipated to begin in late summer. Owners can repair the sidewalk themselves or participate in the city program. In 2021, the sidewalk replacement area will include residential neighborhoods south of I-696/11 Mile, both east and west of Southfield Road, and the entire Southfield Road corridor,

CATCHING UP ON CANNABIS

Planning Commission recently reviewed zoning and general code language related to recreational cannabis. If City Councils votes to allow these uses in the city, the ordinance would allow for 2 provisioning centers (dispensaries or retail locations) and 2 testing facilities in the Mixed-Use and Commercial Vehicular Districts.

To provide ample opportunity for residents to learn more about the proposed ordinance and provide comments, an open house was held on Wednesday, May 26 in the Community Room at City Hall. Information will remain on display until June 7 in exhibit hall format. The next step is for Planning Commission to hold a public hearing to receive comments from residents, businesses, and property owners in the city on **Tuesday, June 15 at 7 PM** during the regular Planning Commission meeting.

Residents are strongly encouraged to provide their feedback on cannabis through comment cards at City Hall, bv participating in our online survey. bv emailing the Citv Clerk at cityclerk@lathrupvillage.org, or dropping a note in the city's drop box outside City Hall. Comments and questions will be compiled into FAQs for the website and will be provided to Planning Commissioners and City Council.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

Summer is around the corner

Tallgrass must be maintained under 7 inches or seed-bearing height, whichever is less. Otherwise, it may be ordered cut by the City and the property owner will be charged with the cost. This can also result in a lien on the property as a Special Assessment. Wood and logs that are stored outside must be on a rack that keeps the firewood 8 inches above the ground and must be placed 12 inches away from any property line. This is to help prevent the infestation of rodents.

Right-of-Way (ROW) Maintenance – This is generally considered the area between the sidewalk and the street. The maintenance of this area is the responsibility of the adjacent property owner. City ordinances only permit vegetation in the ROW area. Because so many residents have placed decorative rocks in this area, an Administrative Order is in place that allows for small rocks and decorative items. These non-vegetation items must be placed at least 12 inches from the road.

Help us determine if their water service line is lead, copper, or galvanized steel. Follow the steps below. All you will need is a coin and a magnet. To take a picture, a cellphone is recommended.

- Go online to the Water Service Line Inquiry form at https://arcg.is/1P5rPe or Use the QR Code
- Click on the link to the NPR tool at https://apps.npr.org/find-lead-pipes-in-your-home/en/#intro
- Enter the information requested on the survey, add a picture, and click SUBMIT!



If you are unable to complete this survey, the City will be required to verify your water service material. You will need to schedule a time to inspect your water meter.
