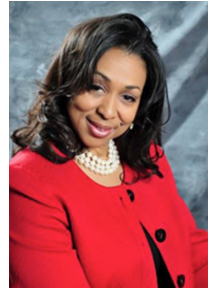

MAYOR'S MEMO



Welcome to 2021 Villagers!

I hope everyone is staying safe and wearing your masks diligently. Even though the curve may be flattening, we all must do our part to stay vigilant about wearing our masks and practicing social distancing.

There has been a lot of discussion regarding the two bonds that were approved at the March 1st council meeting. I want to address a couple of items. First, the reason the bond posting was put into the Oakland Press paper rather than the Southfield Sun was simply because of a deadline and costs. There was no nefarious activity behind it and, just like most of the residents, many of the council members asked the same question. We understand that not everyone receives the Oakland Press and because of that, going forward we will make every effort to put all notices in the Southfield Sun.

In regards to the bonds, here is some information that hopefully will help:

The first bond is for streets - \$5.845 million was approved by the voters and places an estimated 3.9307 mills (\$3.92 per \$1,000) on property taxes starting in July. Based on the average taxable value (\$67,000), this is \$263 a year for a homeowner which is approximately \$22 a month. The second bond is for capital improvements – water/sewer - \$5.38 million. Will be paid through the addition of approximately \$10.42 a month onto the water/sewer bills.

We also have received numerous inquiries regarding water bills. The minimum water bill is \$50.53. Included in that amount is the cost to purchase water from the South Oakland County Water Authority (SOCWA), salaries, water system maintenance, water loss, and water main replacement projects. There is also a charge for the water meter, based on its size. The sewer costs are similar to the water. The expenses for the sewer include sewage disposal services charged by the Evergreen Farmington Sewage Disposal System (EFSDS) and the Great Lakes Water Authority (GLWA), capital expenditure, sewer system maintenance, and operating the sanitary retention tank.

- On March 1, unpaid taxes were turned over to the Oakland County Treasurer. If you have outstanding taxes, call Oakland County at (248) 858-0611 for a revised tax bill.
- New residents, file your property transfer affidavit with the City Treasurer's Office by May 1, 2021.
- Special Assessments that were not paid by March 26 will be added to the summer tax bill.
- Your 2021 summer tax bills will be mailed out the first week of July.

UPCOMING INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS AND UPDATES

The Council approved bonding \$5.38 million needed for the public infrastructure improvements. The work will start this year and extend over 3 years. The project includes:

WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS - Replacement of water mains, water meters, gate valves, fire hydrants

LEAD AND COPPER WATER SERVICE LINE – Verifications, inspections, and replacements from the water main to the water meter where lead service lines are identified

SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS - Sanitary sewer retention tank improvements and replacement of force mains and lateral sewer lines

SIDEWALK, DITCH AND DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS - Much of this work will be repaid through special assessments and direct billing to residents.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN 2021

FIRE HYDRANTS – Most were installed in the 1920s. Many existing hydrants are the screw-top version and should not require much excavation in order to replace them. During the process, any rust will be scraped off. Some homes in the area may temporarily experience rust-colored water.

- Install 11 fire hydrants in new locations
- Replace or refurbish 45 existing fire hydrants

GATE VALVES – These valves isolate water for the repair of water mains. Most were installed in the 1920s. New gate valves are also required in order to be in compliance with the current standards.

- Install 8 gate valves in new locations
- Replace or refurbish 67 existing gate valves

VERIFICATION OF WATER SERVICE LINE MATERIAL - As a result of unfunded State regulations, by 2025 the City is required to identify the material of all water service pipes leading into homes and businesses. Any service line that consists of a lead or galvanized steel is required to be replaced with the cost born completely by the City. Approximately 500 verifications will occur per year and will include the replacement of Stop Boxes.

LEAD SERVICE LINE REPLACEMENTS – We do not believe that there is an excessive number of lead and/or galvanized water lines in the City. The Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes & Energy (EGLE) requires all communities to start the verification process this year and begin replacing a minimum of 5 percent of those identified each year. In 2021, we are planning to schedule the replacement of 10 water service lines.

WATER METER REPLACEMENTS - The water meter stock in Lathrup Village is dated and most have outlived their expected life. Some are reporting inconsistent readings. A testing process of meters in the homes has been initiated. It is anticipated that meters will need to be replaced. A request for proposal will be issued for new water meters with real-time reporting of usage.

WATER MAIN REPLACEMENTS - Wiltshire and San Rosa water mains will be replaced this summer.

SANITARY SEWER REPAIRS - Repairs to sewer lines will occur based upon this year's sewer line inspections.

SANITARY RETENTION TANK - The "Tank" is part of the Evergreen Farmington Sanitary Sewage District, which has recently become a Chapter 20 Drainage District. In order to increase capacity, prevent frequent spills and basement backups, and address the Corrective Action Plan (CAP) under the Administrative Consent Order (ACO), the Tank requires significant upgrades and expansion of its capacity.

STREET REPAVING PROJECT 2021 – This project is scheduled to begin in early May and will include jet cleaning of culverts and culvert extensions. Eight properties on Cambridge with culverts that require replacement have the option of paying themselves or seeking a special assessment. Parts of the following streets will undergo pavement activities: Alhambra, Avilla, Cambridge, Glenwood West, Santa Barbara South, Santa Barbara North, San Jose, Sunset, Sunnybrook, and Wiltshire.

SIDEWALKS – the Sidewalk Replacement Program is expected to span over 3 years. The property owner remains responsible for the costs of the repair/replacement. Owners can repair the sidewalk themselves or participate with the city contractor. Under the city program, permit fees are waived and the payments may be spread over 2 years. In 2021, the sidewalk replacement area will include:

- Southfield Road Commercial Corridor between Lincoln and 12 Mile Road
- Residential areas south of I-696/11 Mile, both east and west of Southfield Road



The City will soon launch a website that will have an up-to-date description and schedule of all the various infrastructure activities. This will help residents to remain informed about the various projects and plan accordingly.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Yard waste collection will begin on **Monday, April 5, 2021**. Compostable items such as leaves, weeds, twigs (under 2 inches in diameter and broken/cut), etc. should be placed in yard waste bags. Alternatively, yard waste may be placed in plastic garbage cans marked with the SOCRRA “YARD WASTE” stickers, which are available at no cost at the city hall. 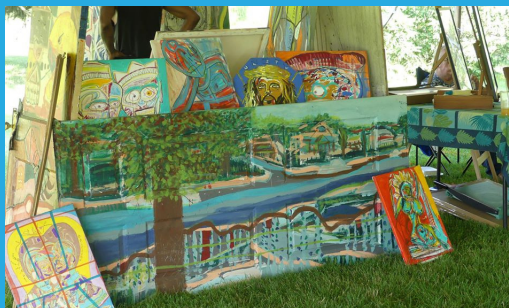

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

Lathrup Village Planning Commission and CEDD have been working hard over the past year and a half to update the city's Comprehensive Master Plan. This document represents the long-term vision of our wonderful community and provides the framework for how we would like to see development happen. It covers areas such as housing, commercial corridors, sustainability, and future land uses – all with an eye towards improving the quality of life for Lathrup Village residents.

CANNABIS UPDATES

In August 2020, at the recommendation of the Marijuana Study Group, City Council directed Planning Commission and staff to draft ordinance language to permit recreational, adult-use cannabis in the City. Currently, there is a moratorium on all medical and recreational cannabis uses in the City. Over the past few months, there have been meetings, discussions, and revisions with the goal of putting together a comprehensive and thoughtful ordinance for the City Council to consider. The Planning Commission and staff intend to have another draft available for review in April/May.

In February 2021, City Council adopted ordinance language specific to Primary Caregivers, which are regulated differently than medical and recreational cannabis. These amendments to the zoning ordinance to provide reasonable regulations and standards for Cannabis Primary Caregivers operating in the city. Most notably Primary Caregivers will now be required to locate in the Office District along 12 Mile Road and adhere to standards related to noise, odor, security, permitting, site plan review, and business licensing.

Prior to enacting these ordinance amendments, properly registered Primary Caregivers could locate anywhere in the city, most often in our neighborhoods. To help better understand the differences between Primary Caregivers, Medical Cannabis, and Adult-Use (Recreational) Cannabis and why the city took action to adopt these recent zoning ordinance amendments, the city's planning consultants have put together a brief presentation which may be found on the CED page.

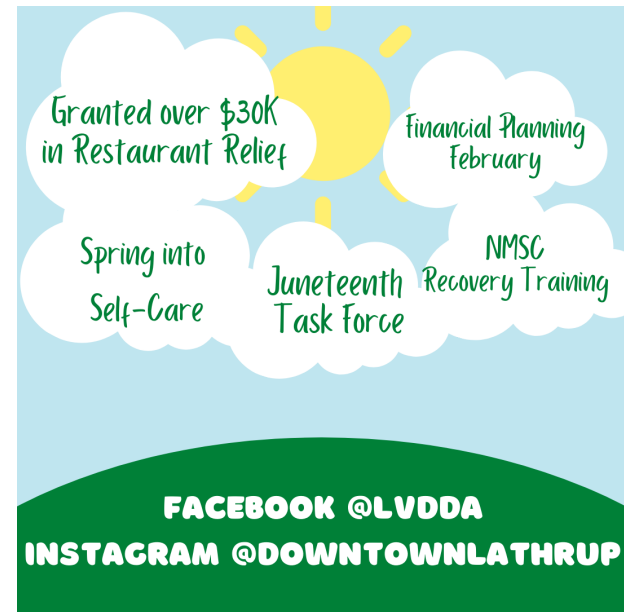

WATER METER SURVEY

We have beautiful historic homes here! Some Lathrup Village homes were built up to 100 years ago. For the health and safety of our residents, the City of Lathrup Village is required to determine your water service line material to identify if there is possible lead exposure in drinking water, which may cause health risks. We are asking our residents to help us determine if their water service line is lead, copper, or galvanized steel.

Follow the steps below. All you will need is a coin and a magnet. To take a picture, a cellphone is recommended.

- Go online to the Water Service Line Inquiry form at <https://arcg.is/1P5rPe> or Use the QR Code
- Click on the link to the NPR tool at <https://apps.npr.org/find-lead-pipes-in-your-home/en/#intro>
- Enter the information requested on the survey, add a picture, and click SUBMIT!



If you have a lead or galvanized water service, the City of Lathrup Village is required to replace the water line at no cost to you.

If you are unable to complete this survey, the City will be required to verify your water service material. You will need to schedule a time to inspect your water meter.
