



The NC Senior Tar Heel Legislature was created by the NC General Assembly with the passage of Senate Bill 479 in 1993. It was created to:

- Provide information to senior citizens on the legislative process and matters being considered by the North Carolina General Assembly.
- Promote citizen involvement and advocacy concerning aging issues before the North Carolina General Assembly.
- Assess the legislative needs of older citizens by convening a forum modeled after the North Carolina General Assembly

2009 Legislative Priorities

- 1. Provide funding to sustain Project C.A.R.E. (Caregiver Alternatives to Running on Empty). Project C.A.R.E. provides information, referral, consultation and linkage to caregivers of persons afflicted with Alzheimer's disease.
- 2. Increase funding for home and community based services for older adults by increasing the Home and Community Care Block Grant by \$5 million. Home and community-based services include home-delivered meals, adult day care, health care, in-home aid and other services that help impaired older adults stay in their homes. These services are less costly than institutional care.
- 3. Increase funding for senior centers by an additional \$2,000,000 in recurring funds for a total of \$3,265,316 a year.
- 4. Implement practical and cost-effective steps to address concerns related to the mixing of populations, including younger adults with mental illness and frail older persons residing in long term care facilities.
- 5. Establish a cap on the increase in the assessed value of property determined during revaluations for persons over the age of 65, eligible for the Homestead Exemption. Revise the limits of the Act to income of \$35,000.

Medicare Information

The Seniors' Health Insurance Information
Program (SHIIP) answers questions and counsels
Medicare beneficiaries and caregivers about
Medicare, Medicare supplements, Medicare
Advantage, Medicare prescription drug plans, long-term care insurance and other health insurance
concerns. The counselors on our toll free line offer
free and unbiased counseling on Medicare health
care products. The North Carolina SMP Program
provides assistance with Medicare/Medicaid billing
errors, fraud and abuse.

Extra Help Program

Do you know someone who is on Medicare and needs assistance in paying for their prescription drugs? Medicare beneficiaries may be eligible for the federal **Extra Help** low income subsidy program if he/she has limited income and resources. The Extra Help program can increase cost savings by paying for all or part of the monthly premiums, annual deductibles and provide lower prescription co-payments under a Medicare prescription drug plan. To qualify for Extra Help, the annual income must be limited to \$16,245 for an individual (\$21,855 for a married couple living together). Additionally, the total resources must be limited to \$12,510 for an individual (\$25,010 for a married couple living together). The resources do not include a primary residence or a vehicle.

Dutch researchers say that caregivers face increasing demands along with coping with the devastating effects stroke has on their friends and family members.

However, there is a psychological upside, the researchers say. The caregivers "not only experience burden, but they may also experience gains as a result of caregiving. Pride, gratification, a closer feeling to their loved one; these are positive things that develop when one cares for another."

The researchers' recommendations include sharing responsibilities and occasional relief from caregiving tasks to help reduce the toll both emotionally and physically put on the individual care. 
