Prostate Cancer Awareness Month

Prostate cancer is second only to lung cancer in annual deaths of U.S. men. It is the single most common form of solid tumor in humans. In North Carolina, there are about 7000 men diagnosed with prostate cancer and about 800 die of this chronic disease every year.

It is estimated that there are more than 9 million men with prostate cancer worldwide. This number will grow dramatically as the millions of "boomers" enter their 40s, 50s and 60s.

There is good news that men are living longer after being diagnosed with prostate cancer because of early detection. Multiple organizations recommend annual testing for all men aged 40 and older. If there is a family history of this cancer or if one is African-American, then screening may begin at age 35. Annual testing involves a blood test, prostate specific antigen (PSA) and a digital rectal exam (DRE). Usually, there are no signs or symptoms of one having prostate cancer – it is a 'silent disease'.

Early detection and treatment is the best hope for success. Just like with other cancers, the sooner it is detected and treated the better are the chances of being "cured". The Prostate Cancer Coalition of North Carolina has a web site that offers valuable information about prostate cancer, especially the newly diagnosed — www.pccnc.org.

One myth is that prostate cancer is an 'old man's disease'. Not true. Men at risk need to establish baselines and monitor with an annual PSA blood test. Each man should know his score = the actual PSA number. There are profiles for the PSA number for age, race and change in the number over time (known as PSA velocity) that better predict the occurrence of prostate cancer.


