Guilt: Dealing with the Monkey on Your Back

Guilt is one of the most common emotions that family caregivers experience. At one time or another it may feel like a constant companion like the proverbial "monkey on your back." Guilt can trigger a

what you should and should not do; questioning every step you take in your caregiving journey.

Here are a few comments that might emerge from guilt

from family caregivers: "Have I done enough?" "I resent my (brother) (sister) (spouse) because they don't help." "My mother wants me to spend more time with her at the assisted living. But I have a job and husband. I always feel guilty, although living there is the best thing for her." "What about my life and my needs?"

Denying feelings of guilt won't make them go away. In fact, ignoring the guilt may lead to depression, angry outbursts, problems with sleep, overeating, and strained relationships with family, friends and co-workers. **Practical Ways to cope with guilt:**

Acknowledge that you feel guilty.

- Make a list of all the things that make you feel guilty and then write down answers to the questions below.
- What is causing you to feel guilty?
- What control do you have over the situation?
- What are you willing to let go of that will help you feel less guilty?
- Forgive yourself for feeling guilty. It is a normal human emotion.

Remember, In caregiving, things do happen and our responses are normal, to be expected. It's just part of life and some things we simply must accept and live with and forgive ourselves.
