Dear Family Caregivers,

November is National Family Caregivers Month.

It is a time to acknowledge the important role that family, friends and neighbors play

in providing care for their loved ones.

Did you know Family caregivers provide an estimated \$450 billion worth of uncompensated care to loved ones annually? In addition, according to the Family Caregiver Alliance, unpaid family caregivers will likely continue to be the largest source of long term care services in the U.S.

A *Family Caregiver* refers to "anyone who provides assistance to someone else who is, in some degree, incapacitated and needs help: a husband who has suffered a stroke; a wife with Parkinson's disease; a mother-in-law with cancer; a grandfather with Alzheimer's disease."

I would encourage all Family Caregivers to take time to celebrate who you are, and the importance of what you are doing. While November may be the official month to recognize your acts as a family caregiver, every day is one in which YOU make a difference.

This is a reminder of the importance of taking care of you, so take some time out for yourself. You deserve it, and it's a critical part of tending to your own wellbeing. Stress can wreak havoc on an otherwise healthy body. Let's face it, if you're not well, you won't be able to do the things you need to do.

So, I urge you to spend some time focusing on yourself. If you are a full time caregiver, ask a trusted friend to stay with your loved one for an hour or two, or perhaps consider a weekend of respite care if that's a possibility.



The State Health Plan is conducting Open Enrollment for benefits effective January 1, 2014. The Open Enrollment period was set to end October 31, 2013. To encourage members to take action and allow them more time, the Plan has extended Open Enrollment until November 15, 2013.

As a reminder, if Active/Non-Medicare primary members take no action during Open Enrollment, they and any enrolled dependents on their plan will be enrolled in the Traditional 70/30 Plan effective January 1, 2014. If Medicare Primary members take no action, any currently enrolled dependents, if applicable, will be enrolled into the Medicare Advantage Plan in which they were assigned effective January 1, 2014.
