Veteran's Designation on North Carolina Driver's License

On March 7, 2014, demonstrating veteran status became a reality and is as simple as showing a NC driver's license. Veterans who have been honorably discharged from any branch of the U.S. Military can now get "VETERAN" designation on their license.

Any Department of Motor Vehicle office can issue the new license. A veteran does not have to wait until renewal if they wish to obtain a "VETERAN" designated license. To apply, an honorably discharged veteran must apply in person to any DMV office and present the following documents:

- Current driver's license
- ◆ DD214 can be a copy as long as not altered
- ♦ \$10, same as duplicate license

The new driver's license will be mailed to the veteran within 8-10 days.
