NC Senior Tar Heel Legislature

The NCSTHL met in Raleigh October 9-10 for its final meeting of 2014. During the meeting various committees met to discuss resolutions and establish NCSTHL priorities for the next two years.

The STHL 2014-15 new legislative priorities are: 1)
Preserve or Restore Optional Medicaid Services; 2)
Maintain funding for senior centers; 3) Strengthen and fund North Carolina's Adult Protective Services
