EXCITING NEWS FROM COLTS - County of Lee Transit System

Public transportation getting you safely to your destination.

COLTS along with the assistance from ITRE - Institute for Transportation Research and Education at NC State University and NCDOT Public Transportation Division are pioneering a new zone structured scheduling system. Zoning public transportation in Lee County will offer more options for passengers, increase efficiency, increase customer satisfaction, reduce overall costs to the system and streamline scheduling.

What's different from before?

- Lee County has been divided into zone sections. They are Sanford Downtown, Deep River, Cape Fear, Broadway, Carolina Trace, Lemon Springs, Tramway, Pocket and West Sanford.
- Passengers schedule their appointments according to the zone section schedules.
- Additional stops on Sanford in-town loop.
- Pinehurst medical trips 5 days a week.
- **Options** for last minute appointments.

Driving Tips from the National Weather Service

According to the Federal Highway Administration, the vast majority of weather-related auto crashes happen on **wet pavement and during rainfall.** These tips can assist you in other types of inclement weather as well.

- \Rightarrow Slow down and allow more travel time.
- ⇒ Allow at least TWICE the normal following distance between cars to provide ample room for stopping.
- \Rightarrow Avoid cruise control.
- \Rightarrow Avoid hard braking or turning sharply.
- ⇒ Make sure your HEADLIGHTS are ON in the rain (and other types of inclement weather). It's the law! Wipers on lights on!
- ⇒ If you feel your car beginning to skid, continue to look and steer in the direction you want the car to go. Avoid slamming on the brakes.
