If you are caring for a loved one with dementia and plan on or would like to take a vacation, use these tips.

- Keep the Anticipation Short Notice early on that when anyone references an upcoming trip, your loved one might become anxious. Tell the loved one its ages away. It should help reassure them. Wait until a few days before departure to revisit the subject.
- Simplify the Travel Information Share a few details such as who is going on the trip; when you are departing; the town you are visiting; the return date. Type or print in extra-large font and place in an area easily accessed by the loved one. Add a nice picture.
- Accept All Offers of Help Need we say more, here? As offers are made, begin a schedule.
- Let the Staff Know If your loved one lives at a facility, speak with each regular staff member individually and provide an itinerary copy and any additional phone numbers. This minimizes confusion.
- Send Regular Updates Email or text to check in and share one or two light and fun details of the day.
