The Lee County Veteran Services Officer (VSO) assists eligible

veterans and their families, deceased veteran's dependents and survivors in applying for benefits from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and the N.C. Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (NCDMVA).

Members of the Reserves, National Guard and active duty service members are also welcomed to call the county VSO for assistance with any matters involving the VA.

While Lee County is not the authorizing organization for these benefits, the County Veterans Service Officer can assist the veteran greatly in the following areas:

- Assessing and confirming eligibility
- Completing the documentation required by the VA and NCDMVA
- Explaining complex issues and forms
- Referring veterans and service members to other agencies that may be of assistance

The mission of Lee County Veterans Services is to pursue a high quality of life for local veterans, their families and their survivors.

It is our goal to increase public awareness of the services available to veterans and their families. We advocate for Lee County veterans and their families by assisting them in obtaining the benefits to which they are entitled.

Prescription Drug Assistance Available for Low-Income Medicare Beneficiaries

From the NC Department of Insurance, Raleigh Seniors' Health Insurance Information Program

Medicare beneficiaries who have limited incomes and assets may be eligible for **Extra Help** to pay for their prescription drugs. The federal Low-Income Subsidy (LIS) program, also known as Extra Help, assists qualified Medicare beneficiaries with out-of-pocket expenses associated with Medicare Part D prescription drugs.

There are more than 80,000 Medicare beneficiaries in North Carolina who may be eligible for help but have yet to apply. SHIIP, the Seniors' Health Insurance Information Program and a division of the N.C. Department of Insurance, is joining with partners around the state to help beneficiaries understand and apply for Extra Help. "Many who are eligible for this assistance are not aware that it is available to them," said Insurance Commissioner Mike Causey. "It is our goal to get the message of Extra Help out to Medicare beneficiaries statewide and get them enrolled so they can begin receiving help with their Medicare prescription drug costs."

SHIIP (Seniors Health Insurance Information Program) can help Medicare beneficiaries in Lee County with the enrollment process for Extra Help. Please contact Janice Holmes, Lee County SHIIP Coordinator at 919-776-0501 ext. 2206 to schedule an appointment.

To qualify for Extra Help, a Medicare beneficiary must meet certain income, resource and asset level requirements. The income and asset limits for Extra Help are \$1,508 per month with assets up to \$13,820 if you are single, and \$2,030 per month with assets up to \$27,600 if you are married.

SHIIP, a division of the North Carolina Department of Insurance, has volunteers in all 100 counties in North Carolina who offer one-on-one counseling and provide free, unbiased information about Medicare, Medicare supplements, Medicare Part D, Medicare Advantage and health plan options and long-term care insurance. 

Stroke is the fifth leading cause of death in the U.S. and a leading cause of adult disability.

Someone in the U.S. has a stroke about once every 40 seconds.

Major risk factors for stroke include high blood pressure, smoking, diabetes, high cholesterol, heart disease and atrial fibrillation.

You may be able to prevent stroke or reduce your risk through healthy lifestyle changes.

Medicare covers several preventive services at no cost that may improve your health.

MEN'S HEALTH MONTH

June is the month that we celebrate dads. What better time is there for men to get their health screenings scheduled?

Even healthy men need to get health screenings for preventive care.

If you are a man with Medicare coverage, now is the time to talk with your doctor about getting screened for prostate cancer, colorectal cancer and cardiovascular disease.

Medicare covers prostate screenings once every 12 months for men over 50 and the colorectal screening tests every 120 months, unless at high risk.

Cardiovascular screenings can detect conditions that could lead to heart attack or stroke and are covered by Medicare once every five years.

To be eligible for the screening, you must: have a physician or medical home, have no previous history of breast cancer, not have any present symptoms, not be pregnant or breastfeeding, be at least 35 years old for a baseline (first time) mammogram (check with insurance), be at least 40 years old for an annual mammogram, not have had a mammogram within the last 12 months, must not have breast implants or breast augmentation.
