Economic Development/ Community AffairsBlakey

Trustee Blakey reported construction is well underway for Dollar General. He indicated he is looking forward to the Grand Opening. Trustee Blakey also mentioned he is looking forward to the groundbreaking for Dunkin Donuts (Torrence & Glenwood Dyer Rd.)

Trustee Blakey mentioned the well-attended Quality of Life Plan meeting held in Nov. He gave an update of the importance of Lynwood becoming a 10,000 person voting block and how that would allow additional resources to come in to our community.

Trustee Blakey encouraged residents to participate in the Festival of Lights being hosted by the Village. This is being done in honor of the upcoming Holidays. There will be 1st, 2nd and 3rd place prizes. The reason for this is to foster community engagement.

Trustee Blakey announced the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners of the Fall Beautification Contest. The First Place winner was Ms. Salazar, Second Place was a tie between Ms. Henri, and Ms. Daniels, and the Third Place winner was Ms. Freeman. The winners received gift cards of varied amounts.

Parks & Recreation.....Dunlap

Trustee Dunlap explained the rules and regulations which will be posted at “Luna Land Dog Park”. All residents are to abide by the posted rules and regulations of the park.

A new flag which will be hung at the Veteran’s Memorial Park was donated by Mr. Fred Miller III. This was done in honor of his brother who sacrificed his life for our county.

Planning & Zoning.....Lilly /Clark

Trustee Lilly was absent, Trustee Marshall moved, supported by Trustee Clark, to approve the **First Read of Ordinance # 21-54**, an Ordinance of the Village of Lynwood, Illinois amending the code of the Village of Lynwood, Illinois, Chapter 114” Zoning’, Article III, “Districts”, Article VI, “Special Uses” and Article XIV, Cemeteries.

Attorney Boyle explained this Ordinance was initiated by a group called the Center of Islamic Teachings and Community Development. This Ordinance establishes the ability to issue a special use permit for a cemetery.

Attorney Boyle explained this was brought before the Zoning Board and the owner of the property would like to subdivide this property. We are Tabling this at this time in order to proceed with the changes necessary within our Code of Ordinances.

FinanceEaves

Chief Dempsey mentioned the newly installed Flock License plate reader camera system that is now able to read 727,213 license plates. This can be used for the Police as well as for community development showing a company how many cars pass through Lynwood.

Chief of Police Report

- The newly installed Flock License Plate Reader Camera System has read 727,213 license plates in one month. This just proves there is a lot of traffic coming and going through Lynwood. The reports from these cameras could also be used for community development. Showing a company's how many cars pass through Lynwood could be used as a great selling point to bring more businesses into Lynwood.
- Our written Sergeants Exam will be held March 3, 2022 at 10:00am, in the Lynwood training room. Resource Management Associates is the company that will be administering the written test as well as the assessment portion. The officers that have signed up to take the exam have 60 days to get the reading material I posted from Resource Management and study for the written exam.
- We are again looking for more police officers. We lost two sergeants and one patrolman in the past month and need to replace them. We are currently taking applications for lateral hires. We are swearing in a new officer tonight.

- On December 7, 2021, a Lynwood officer pulled over a vehicle on 199th @ Park for no taillights. A records search of the driver showed the driver had a suspended drivers license. The driver was placed into custody and prior to being placed in the squad car he was searched. The driver was in possession of Oxycodone, Xanax, and Cannabis. The driver was charged with felony possession of a controlled substance, possession of cannabis and driving while suspended.
- On December 3, 2021, Lynwood police officer pulled over a vehicle at 201st @ Park for suspended registration. The officer approached the vehicle and noticed open alcohol near the passenger, vodka, and beer. Both subjects were asked to step out of the vehicle. The passenger became combative and was placed in handcuffs. She was then searched, and officers recovered from her pocket a clear plastic baggie containing what was later field tested for Ecstasy. The driver attempted to discard another plastic baggie which later field tested for cannabis. Both subjects were arrested. The passenger was charged with felony possession of a controlled substance and the driver was charged with suspended registration, possession of cannabis, and open alcohol.
- On December 1, 2021, officers responded to a call of an unknown disturbance involving an orange Dodge Charger at 19909 Arroyo. As officers were enroute to the address, they observed the Dodge Charger in question and attempted to pull the vehicle over. The driver then attempted to flee at a high rate of speed but crashed at Burnham & Brentwood. The driver of the Charger crawled out of the vehicle as officers approached. Officers recognized the subject as William Owens from 851 Valerie, Lynwood and knew him to have an active arrest warrant from the Lynwood Police. William Owens also has a suspended drivers license. Owens was transported to the hospital for treatment and then brought back to Lynwood Police Department for processing for the warrant and suspended driver's license. This was the third time William Owens had fled from the police while attempting to pull him over.
- Lynwood Police have recovered 3 guns off the street in the last month.
- We have participated in four wonderful events in the past month that the Community Policing Director will talk about, The Food Drive, Toy Drive, Bowling with Badges, and Santa Cop, AC Elf and Sgt Weinbrecht calling Bingo for Seniors last night. Posted up

front are just some of the pictures taken by John our photographer who has taken nearly 1000 pictures during these events, and we would love for you all to go to the Village and Police Department's Facebook page to see all the pictures. I also want to thank John who does a wonderful job at all these events and deserves a lot of praise for his help. I just want to say Lynwood is doing some great things. If you could see the looks on the kids faces and their excitement when getting stacks of presents or when a little boy says can you, please come back next year. Seeing a mother cry because she is so appreciative for the food and gifts for her children. Lynwood is truly a community that comes together to take care of each other, and we are all proud to be part of this.

- I also have some stats to compare from last year;
 - During the months of September, October, and November in 2020, the total number of motor vehicle thefts were 11 and during those months this year, the total number of motor vehicle thefts were 4.
 - During those same months in 2020, we had a total of 14 burglaries to motor vehicles and in 2021 during those months, we had only 2.
 - In 2020 during the months of September, October, and November, we had a total of 2 residential burglaries and the same amount this year. No change there.
 - We had a total of 274 traffic stops during the months of September, October, and November in 2020 and for this year in those same months, we had 497 t-stops total.
 - During those same months last year, our citation total was approximately 183 and this year, the total citation total is 407. Definitely an increase there, over double the amount as last year.
 - So comparing this year to last year during the last three months, motor vehicle thefts and burglaries to motor vehicles has decreased a great deal. The traffic stops have increased almost double and the citation count is over double. We are proud of our officers for being more pro-active because it is truly showing.

- Two of our police officers just completed a 40-hour evidence technician course. We now have 11 certified evidence technicians on our department.
- We have recently had a clean-up in which several officers assisted. We filled a 30-yard dumpster with old items from several years ago that was in our garage and shed areas. In a team effort, we finally disposed of items that should have been disposed of a long time ago.
- Our Nixle access is up and running. Nixle is a notification system that keeps the community up to date with important information from your local public safety departments. Please follow the directions on the flyer given in-order to be added to our NIXLE roster. This will allow the Village and/or Police Department to communicate via text, email, and/or audio message.
- Our kennel for stray animals in the rear of the station is almost complete. We must now finalize the electric for the heat. The second kennel will be built in the Spring and all those materials have already been donated. Special thanks to Home Depot and George Del Rio for donating materials, and also special thanks to officers Oszust, Spierowski, Sinnott, Lindley, and Karlson for donating their time and skills.
- We have recently hired a part time records clerk. She started this week.
- BINGO at LakePointe Senior living was a success. Last night Chief, Sgt. Larry, and I attended their BINGO night and Chief, who was Santa Cop, called numbers. Jack Lencioni donated four \$25.00 gift certificates from Lencioni's to BINGO night and we raffled them off. The seniors loved it and so did we. We had a ball.
- Our soon to be K9 LUNA is now 4 ½ months old. She has gained about 10 pounds and has started some of her puppy training and is doing well.

Community Policing notes for the Board Meeting are as follows:

- Child safety seat installation technician certified. If someone needs help installing a car seat or would like it checked for accuracy, the Lynwood Police Dept. can now provide that service. This will be by scheduled appointment. Now eligible to receive free car seats from different programs, as well as hosting a car seat install/check event in the Spring.
- Block Meeting for Haven Estates and Brook & Orchard Aves went very well, largest turnouts. Next block meeting scheduled 1/12, (Wellington Court)
- Completed this semesters Traffic Stop Safety classes at TF South, Bloom, & Bloom Trail. Next semester Late Feb, early March.
- Bowling with Badges event on 11/20. Provided gift bags and raffled free ice cream/meals from Culvers, Free Bowling from Lynwood Bowl, Trustee Marshall provided multiple gift cards. We had 31 kids in total, Great response from the parents, stated "see you all at the next event".
- Coffee w/ Cop is returning with Evening Edition, so residents are encouraged to come out and get to know your Officers. Thursday 1/13.
- The Lynwood Holiday Ornament is still available for purchase. \$15 each and proceeds have gone to the Food & Toy drives.
- Santa Cop and his 2 elves (A/C Bolde and myself) did Bingo with Seniors last night, and tomorrow will be reading T'was Night Before Xmas to children at Bottles 2 Books daycare and the School.
- Food Drive was completed on 11/19. We donated large boxes of various food including some Thanksgiving essentials plus at least 1 turkey to each family. 20 Lynwood families in total. Donations were as follows: received a lot of various food donations from residents, plus 50 Turkeys from Lencioni's & BNF Foundation, and all Necessary food items from Jewel. Plus, monetary donations from Ray & Wally's, United Liquor, Katie's Café, Inspire Communities (gloves), Mobile(knit hats), Game Tyme, and the Trustees donated Toys and Money as well.
- Toy Drive, Game Tyme hosted an event which donated 3 large garbage bags of Toys, Money, and Gift Card, which was on top of their previous donation of \$2,500. On Saturday December 11th, we had our Toy Drive with 50 children receiving toys.  - Will train, send to fire academy and EMT-B school
 - Currently have 2 candidates that will be taking the agility test and going before the board next month
 - Currently started processing 4 more applications
- Residential Smoke Detector Program

 - Will recommend replacements or install basic smoke detectors based on need
 - Recommended for older homes (30+ years in age)
- The Lynwood First Responders Association along with the Lynwood Police Department will be worked together to support need families this Christmas by giving away donated food items and toys for the kids
