Village of Lynwood Building Department

1. Number of permits issued July 27, 2022 through August 9, 2022
 - a. 38 @ total of \$15,725.20 (valuation of \$417,050)
2. Reminder: Fence construction must be semi-private. That means 20% visibility within the construction of said fence:
 - Sec. 18-300
 - (5) *Prohibited fence materials.* No barbed wire, electric or abnormally sharp picket or stake fence of either wood or metal shall be erected, except as hereinafter provided. No solid panel fences shall be permitted. Spaces between line posts (bay area) shall provide a minimum of 20 percent open space excluding any decorative space above four feet above grade.

Should you decide to ignore these restrictions you will be ticketed and fined up to \$750 along with the replacement of the fence.
