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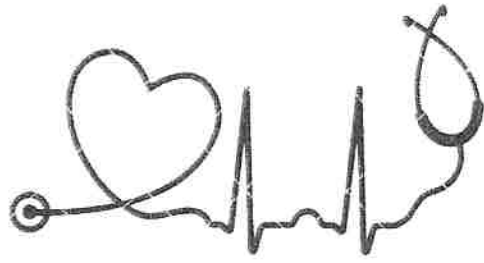
## **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

Chief of Police Report

On June 16, 2023, Detectives re-opened a case reported to Lynwood in 2019 regarding sexual abuse that occurred at a Lynwood address starting in 1999. After locating three of the alleged victims, Detectives were able to arrange interviews. After the interviews were completed, Detectives believe that enough probable cause exists to further investigate the sex abuse allegations. Detectives have discovered the sex abuse claims against the suspect also stem to several different agencies throughout Cook County. This is now an active case and Detectives are working to complete a few more interviews. After the interviews are completed they will present the case to the Cook County State's Attorney office to obtain charges.

Reminder, fireworks are illegal, and you will be fined \$750.00 if found to be using them within the village limits.
