Chairman Chris Tauzin then recognized members of the public who requested to speak.

St. Martin Parish resident Mendy Girouard presented the Council with a petition (on-file)

from residents of the community opposed to Billy Broussard operating a site to haul debris in their neighborhood. The petition contains 66 signatures.

Property owner Billy Broussard briefly addressed the Council (*speech on-file*). Mr. Broussard mentioned that litigation was filed relative to activity being conducted on his property. Mr. Broussard agreed to go through the rezoning process in exchange for lifting the Temporary Restraining Order and terminating the litigation. Finally, Mr. Broussard requested an investigation into the vandalism of the rezoning signs that were placed in the area.

AN ORDINANCE SETTING THE SPEED LIMIT FOR MOTOR VEHICLES ON ISLE LABBE ROAD, LOCATED IN DISTRICT 5, SECTION 47, TOWNSHIP 8 EAST, RANGE 7 EAST, ST. MARTIN PARISH, LOUISIANA, TO PROVIDE FOR THE PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, the ST. MARTIN PARISH GOVERNMENT is in need of one Excavator; and WHEREAS, the Kobelco Financial Services has agreed to lease the Excavator to the St. Martin Parish Government for a period of five (5) years; and

WHEREAS, the lease of the equipment is a "pure" lease and does not provide for a purchase of the Excavator at the end of the lease term; and

WHEREAS, the proposed lease contains a "non-appropriation" provision and an antisubstitution clause:

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Parish President is hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to confect a lease agreement with Kobelco Financial Services for ONE (1) 2022 KOBELCO SK260LC-11 Excavator; the said term of the lease being five (5) years and providing for a monthly lease amount of \$2,788.09.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any accord confected by and between the ST. MARTIN PARISH GOVERNMENT and Kobelco Financial Services shall contain such other terms, conditions, and provisions as the Parish President, acting in his uncontrolled discretion, may deem appropriate.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Parish President is hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to confect a lease agreement with Kobelco Financial Services for ONE (1) 2016 KOBELCO SK75SR Excavator; the said term of the lease being three (3) years and providing for a monthly lease amount of \$658.31.

RESOLUTION NO. 22-017-RS

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PARISH PRESIDENT TO CONFECT A COOPERATIVE ENDEAVOR AGREEMENT WITH CAJUN BROADBAND, INC. FOR THE ACQUISITION AND INSTALLATION OF FIBER IN PORTIONS OF ST. MARTIN PARISH UTILIZING FUNDS FROM THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT.

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 14(C) of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana provides that, "For a public purpose, the state and its political subdivisions...may engage in cooperative endeavors with each other, with the United States or its agencies, or with any public or private association, corporation, or individual"; and

WHEREAS, the Parish desires to cooperate with CAJUN BROADBAND, INC. ("Contracting Party") in the implementation of the Project as hereinafter described; and

WHEREAS, internet services in the 21st century has assumed status as a necessary utility, and access to high-speed internet is critical to the communication of information for individuals and businesses for numerous purposes affecting public health, safety, and welfare, including but not limited to educational and commercial uses (e.g., remote work and education from the home which has become more prevalent, desired, and/or required, particularly during the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, and which often requires high-speed internet for videoconferencing and similar communications), governmental uses (e.g., accessing governmental information and/or applying for government benefits or services), and access to health or safety information or services (including

online videoconferencing for medical consultation and treatment); and

WHEREAS, in March 2020, Dr. Gary Wagner, Professor of Economics at the University of Louisiana-Lafayette, submitted a report to Leslie Durham, the Governor's designee to the Delta Regional Authority which concluded that "high-speed internet access, or broadband, is critical to economic opportunity, job creation, education, and civic engagement"; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Wagner further opined in the said report that there was "strong evidence that consumer broadband speeds are an important causal factor in explaining population changes across the state." Additionally, Dr. Wagner noted that "relative to communities where broadband speeds remain largely unchanged between 2014-2018, the change in population over this period was significantly higher for communities that experienced larger changes in broadband speeds"; and

WHEREAS, the Acadiana Planning Commission ("APC") released in the summer of 2021 a comprehensive broadband assessment for the Acadiana Region which embraces St. Martin Parish; and

WHEREAS, the APC concluded in its assessment that "access to broadband is linked to educational performance, workforce training, health outcomes and employment"; and

WHEREAS, the research of the APC as noted in the aforesaid assessment reflects that "between 2014 and 2018, about 31,000 jobs were lost as a result of poor access to broadband. Further, analysis of Federal Communications Commission (FCC) broadband access data provides strong evidence that faster business download speeds were directly tied to greater job growth"; and

WHEREAS, the APC also observed that as broadband technologies evolved over time, patchwork investments have led to a hybrid network relying on a combination of modern and legacy technologies in many areas where the user experience is often limited by outdated components; and

WHEREAS, it was the position of the APC as set forth in its assessment that "a modern standard for future broadband development in Acadiana should be based on fiberoptic networks with fiber-to-the home offering a minimum speed of 100 Mbps download and 100 Mbps upload"; and

WHEREAS, the APC research as published in its assessment has determined that the median download speed in St. Martin Parish is only 45.60 Mbps and the median upload speed is a mere 9.88 Mbps; and

WHEREAS, another feature of the APC assessment notes that 24.54% of St. Martin Parish households lack any broadband services; and

WHEREAS, ST. Martin Parish Government incorporates herein by reference the entirety of the aforementioned report of Dr. Gary Wagner and the said published assessment of the APC; and

WHEREAS, the Parish has the authority to enter into Cooperative Endeavor Agreements as evidenced by its governmental purpose of ensuring its residents have access to high-speed internet for the overall improvement of the health, safety, and welfare of the Parish, including socioeconomic and geographic equality in access to high-speed internet, and in particular, furnishing high-speed internet to unserved or underserved areas of the Parish due to perceived or actual economic inefficiencies in the private sector which has heretofore led to such areas being underserved in the high-speed internet services market; and

WHEREAS, providing for infrastructure promotes the development of residential households, commerce and industry, and improves the overall quality of life for St. Martin Parish residents and the business community of the Parish; and

WHEREAS, the public purpose of the Project is to ensure the provision of high-speed internet to underserved areas and residents of the Parish in accordance with the public purposes and policies set forth above; and

WHEREAS, the Parish has reasonable expectation of receiving a benefit or value described in detail that is at least equivalent or greater than the consideration described in this Agreement, and the transfer or expenditure of public funds or property in connection with the Project is not a gratuitous donation as more fully set forth below:

BE IT, THEREFORE, RESOLVED that St. Martin Parish President, CHESTER R. CEDARS, be and is hereby authorized to enter into a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with CAJUN BROADBAND, INC. ("Contracting Party") whereby the latter shall acquire, install, source, and supply fiber optic lines and internet connectivity necessary to provide fiber-to-the home high-speed internet at minimum speeds of 100 Mbps download and 100 Mbps upload, scalable to 1,000 Mbps (the Project).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Contracting Party as a condition of the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement, shall agree that its rate structure for services shall be no greater than the prevailing rates for comparable services in the Acadiana Region.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the fiber acquisition and installation, the Project, shall embrace approximately 73,000 feet of fiber-to-the home and include approximately 700 households and 75 businesses. Moreover, the Contracting Party shall continue to pursue it current application for funding via the Granting Unserved Municipalities Broadband Opportunities ("GUMBO") program offered through the Louisiana Office of Broadband Development & Connectivity.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement shall provide that St. Martin Parish will commit \$1.5 million toward the Project identified herein and will offer support in the amount of \$300,000 for the current GUMBO application of the Contracting Party. The source of all monetary contributions of the Parish shall be from its allotment from the American Rescue Plan Act.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Parish President is hereby authorized and directed to incorporate in the said Cooperative Endeavor Agreement such further terms, conditions, and provisions as he deems necessary and fit to confect the accord. As such, he is authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate this resolution.

A RESOLUTION OF THE ST. MARTIN PARISH COUNCIL APPROVING THE AD VALOREM TAX EXEMPTION APPLICATION OF LOUISIANA SUGAR CANE COOPERATIVE, INC. (APPLICATION NUMBER 20170492-B-ITE), ALL RELATIVE TO AN EXEMPTION OF 80% OF AD VALOREM TAXES FOR TEN YEARS.

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 21(F) of the Louisiana Constitution provides that the Louisiana Board of Commerce and Industry ("Board"), with the approval of the Governor of the State of Louisiana ("Governor") may enter into contracts for the exemption of ad valorem taxes for certain industrial and manufacturing ventures; and

WHEREAS, the Governor has established the terms and conditions pursuant to which he will approve contracts for the Industrial Tax Exemption ("Exemption"); and, the Board has promulgated Rules pursuant to which it will approve contracts, all in accordance with Article VII, Section 21(F) of the Louisiana Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the Governor has declared that no Exemption shall be allowed unless approved by the local taxing authorities of the Parish in which the industrial enterprise operates; and

WHEREAS, Louisiana Sugar Cane Cooperative, Inc. has applied for an Industrial Tax Exemption under Application Number 20170492-B-ITE; and

WHEREAS, on January 14, 2022, the Board of Commerce and Industry approved the aforesaid application of Louisiana Sugar Cane Cooperative, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, Louisiana Sugar Cane Cooperative, Inc. has signed an agreement with the Louisiana Department of Economic Development setting forth various terms and obligations associated with the approval and implementation of the Exemption including the obligation of Louisiana Sugar Cane Cooperative, Inc. to maintain the current number of jobs which provide an annual salary of \$222,850.00 over the ten year period of the Exemption; and

WHEREAS, the St. Martin Parish Council has afforded due consideration of the factors set forth in Resolution Number 20-024-RS adopted on April 16, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the St. Martin Parish School Board and the Sheriff of St. Martin Parish have

approved the Exemption; and

WHEREAS, after due deliberation, the St. Martin Parish Council concludes that the Exemption, together with terms and conditions associated therewith and as set forth in the aforementioned accord confected with the Louisiana Department of Economic Development comport with the dictates of economic development and therefore inures to the overall benefit of St. Martin Parish:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the St. Martin Parish Council, in regular and legal session convened this 2nd day of March, 2022, that the Industrial Tax Exemption of Louisiana Sugar Cane Cooperative, Inc. (Application Number 20170492-B-ITE) be and is hereby formally and officially approved.

MARTIN, STATE OF LOUISIANA DESCRIBED IN ORDINANCE NUMBER 21-12-1341, AND EXTENDING THE CESSATION DATE OF THE CURRENT WATERWORKS DISTRICT NO. 4 OF THE PARISH OF ST. MARTIN, ALL IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 5 OF THE SAID ORDINANCE NUMBER 21-12-1341-OR.

WHEREAS, the Home Rule Charter of the Parish of St. Martin, State of Louisiana, as well as the provisions of Chapter 22, Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended, (La. R.S. 33:7702 et seq.), and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto (the "Act"), permit the St. Martin Parish Council (the "Parish Council"), acting as the governing authority of the Parish of St. Martin, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), to create one or more consolidated waterworks districts in the Parish; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to and in compliance with the provisions of the Act, the Parish Council, adopted a resolution on November 2, 2021, declaring its intent to create Consolidated Waterworks District No. 4 of the Parish of St. Martin, State of Louisiana (the "District"), describing the territory to compose the District and the proposed boundaries thereof, ordering and directing the publication of a notice of intention to create the District, and providing for the hearing of any and all objections to the creation thereof; and

WHEREAS, notice of the intent of the Parish Council to create the District was published one time pursuant to the Act in the *Teche News*, the official journal of the Parish, with said publication occurring on November 10, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Parish Council, acting as the governing authority of the Parish, has determined that the creation of the District is in the best interests of the Parish and the inhabitants of the area affected; and

WHEREAS, the St. Martin Parish Council adopted on December 7, 2021, Ordinance Number 21-12-1341-OR which created the District; and

WHEREAS, the creation of the consolidated district described in the said Ordinance Number 21-12-1341-OR requires the abolition of the current Waterworks District No. 4 of the Parish of St. Martin, effective ninety (90) days after the adoption of the said Ordinance on December 7, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the steps necessary to complete the consolidation/creation of the District in question will require several more months, thus, mandating that the current Waterworks District No. 4 of the Parish of St. Martin continue to exist and operate:

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that in accordance with Section 5 of Ordinance Number 21-12-1341-OR adopted on December 7, 2021, Waterworks District No. 4 of the Parish of St. Martin shall continue in existence for an additional 210 days after which it shall cease to exist, unless the St. Martin Parish further extends its existence.

WHEREAS, in connection with the issuance of the Bonds it is also necessary that the Issuer provide for employment of an underwriter and approve the preparation of the Official Statement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the St. Martin Parish Council, that:

SECTION 1. This Governing Authority hereby approves the sale of the Bonds in one or more series for the purpose set forth in the proposition approved by the voters on December 10, 2016. The Bonds shall have the terms and other characteristics as shall be approved by this Governing Authority in a subsequent resolution or resolutions.

SECTION 2. Stifel, Nicolaus & Company Incorporated, of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, is hereby appointed as placement agent/underwriter in connection with the said Bonds, any compensation to be subsequently approved by the Issuer and to be paid from the proceeds of said Bonds and contingent upon the issuance of said Bonds; provided that no compensation shall be due to said placement agent/underwriter unless said Bonds are sold and delivered.

SECTION 3. The Issuer hereby approves the preparation of the Preliminary Official Statement and approves and authorizes delivery of such Preliminary Official Statement to the Underwriter for use in connection with the public offering of the Bonds.
