CONSENT AGENDA:

Moved by Council Member Barber, supported by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman to approve the Consent Agenda.

- A. Moved by Council Member Wessel, supported by Council Member Shirkey to approve check disbursements from September 23, 2022, September 30, 2022 and electronic disbursements.

- B. Moved by Council Member Badley, supported by Council Member Winston to approve payroll for October 14, 2022. Motion passed unanimously.
- C. Moved by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman, supported by Council Member Badley to approve agreement for Ambulance Millage Distribution between the City of Marysville and St. Clair County and authorize the city manager to sign said agreement. Motion passed unanimously.
- D. Moved by Council Member Wessel, supported by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman to approve City Manager review and agreement. Motion passed unanimously.

FOLLOW UP BUSINESS:

- A. Council Member Barber stated that museum and bandshell roundtable discussion comments from citizens are in the agenda packet. A meeting was held with the artifact group, they toured the shipping container. The east bay in the Recreation Center will be used to display items while the basement is also being considered; a warm storage place is also needed for the artifacts. The artifacts will be sorted into three groups, (items relevant to the City of Marysville, items with names distributed to family members or displayed, and items with no ties to the city).
- B. Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman mentioned the artifact group name is “Dream City Preservation Group” and they are looking for additional volunteers.
- C. Mayor Pyden inquired if space is available at 502 Busha to display artifacts. He also commented on the nice job done on the light poles along the river.

MAYOR & COUNCIL/MANAGER COMMENTS:

Council Member Barber mentioned council person candidate Dave Watson was in attendance tonight. He also mentioned working on the monumental task of the museum artifacts if he is reelected to city council.

Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman congratulated Shawn and Nicole Winston and their children representing Marysville homecoming, Zach as the Sophomore Representative and Megan as the Homecoming Queen. She also acknowledged Paul Wessel as being recognized by St. Clair County Heart of Heroes for all of his hard work at Mid-City Nutrition.

City Manager Randy Fernandez announced schedule and zones of leaf pick-up is posted on the city website and will run eight weeks; the Fire Department is having a drive-thru food drive October 15th; road work on Huron will reverse sides this week so please use River Road for park entrance. He thanked St. Clair County Board of Commissioner Duke Dunn for authorizing ARPA Funds to be used toward the bandshell.

Mayor Pyden inquired on the detour used to enter the Chrysler Plant. Administration responded. He also mentioned a Story Book Walk to take place with a date to be determined.
