- A. Approved City Council Minutes of September 13, 2021.
Motion passed unanimously.

ACTION AGENDA:

- A. Moved by Council Member Badley, supported by Council Member Wessel to approve bills in the amount of \$240,520.38 and payroll for October 1, 2021. Motion passed unanimously.
- B. Moved by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman, supported by Council Member Winston to approve payments to Shirkey Electric in the amount of \$6,180.68 for work at Marysville Golf Course, Waste Water Plant and Community Center. Yes: Mayor Pyden, Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman, Council Members Badley, Wessel and Winston. Abstained: Council Member Shirkey. Motion passed.
- C. Moved by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman, supported by Council Member Shirkey to approve recommendation to accept the lowest quote in the amount of \$175,000 from Malcolm Marine, Inc. of St. Clair, Michigan for seawall installation at Mermaid Park. Motion passed unanimously.

Council Member Winston thanked the DPW staff, Public Safety and Water Department for their commitment during the power outage and clean up after the storm. He announced there is a homecoming parade on Friday, October 1st.

Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman agreed with all other council members comments and thanked the departments; she received a call from her favorite cousin Phyllis Richards thanking Barry and the DPW staff for picking up all the branches in her front yard, it was very much appreciated and she is excited to get Mermaid Park underway.

City Manager Randy Fernandez received a call from St. Clair County Emergency Management Director, Justin Westmiller inquiring if Marysville will call a “Local State of Emergency.” Public Safety Chief Konik responded.
