CITIZENS TO BE HEARD:

- A. J. Vokes, 996 St. Joseph thanked the DPW staff for a job well done on the Fallen Heroes banners; thanked City Council, Police and Fire for their participation in the Memorial Day Parade; June 11th Post #449 retired 454 flags and the car show in the park was phenomenal.
- B. W. Mueller, Birch View Condo Association President stated he is happy with the city; however, residents of the association would like an explanation on the water/sewer bill increase. He also mentioned road problems on Cuttle Rd. in front of the condos.
- C. J. Quinlan, 195 Sandpiper praised city council for being a dedicated group and encouraged them to turn on their microphones when speaking so everyone at home can hear the meetings.
- D. E. Deising, 1428 Georgia inquired about road repairs on Georgia and 14th Street.

CONSENT AGENDA:

Moved by Council Member Barber, supported by Council Member Shirkey to approve the Consent Agenda.

- A. Approved Public Hearing minutes and City Council minutes from May 23, 2022.
- B. Approved the following City Managers appointment: Housing Commission: David Smith - Term Expiring 6/30/27.
Motion passed unanimously.

ACTION AGENDA:

- A. Moved by Council Member Badley, supported by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman to approve check disbursements from May 20, 2022, May 27, 2022 and June 3, 2022 which include payments to Shirkey Electric in the amount of \$15,451.43 for work done at City Hall, Wastewater Plant, Water Plant, Parks and the Golf Course. Yes: Mayor Pyden, Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman, Council Members Badley, Barber and Winston. Abstained: Council Member Shirkey. Motion passed.

- B. Moved by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman, supported by Council Member Winston to approve payroll for June 24, 2022 and electronic disbursements. Motion passed unanimously.
- C. Moved by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman, supported by Council Member Shirkey to approve lowest cost responsive bid in the amount of \$0.0784/gallon from Biotech Agronomics of Beulah, MI for a 5-year contract of biosolids hauling services. Motion passed unanimously.
- D. Moved by Council Member Barber, supported by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman to approve the adoption of Ordinance No. 481 to allow the issuance and sale of bonds in an amount not to exceed \$4,900,000.00 for the CWSRF Wastewater System Improvements. Motion passed unanimously.
- E. Moved by Council Member Winston, supported by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman to approve to move forward with the Wastewater Treatment Plant Influent Screen Replacement Project without project engineering oversight. Motion passed unanimously.

FOLLOW UP BUSINESS:

- A. City Manager Fernandez recapped on the FY23 amounts and roads slated to be repaired.
- B. Council Member Barber inquired if residents can be informed by letter or newsletter on road improvements. He also gave his thoughts regarding a newspaper article on Hot Wheels weekend.
- C. Council Member Shirkey responded to the Hot Wheels weekend financial increase due to the growth of the community event.

MAYOR & COUNCIL/MANAGER COMMENTS:

Council Member Winston announced that on June 14th Marysville Park will be hosting Girls Softball Division I and Division IV quarter finals; mentioned the park was packed last weekend with Little League girls' softball teams, family picnics and the car show which took a moment to honor veterans. He also mentioned his uncle whom just passed being a WWII Vet so his thoughts and prayers went out to all in the community of Marysville.

Council Member Barber stated the Wills Saint Claire Museum car show was very nice; Summerfest will hold a car show with 50 participants and gave his condolences to the Osentoski family on the passing of Ernie who was a veteran and worked 33 years for the City of Marysville.

Council Member Shirkey mentioned the carnival will be in town this weekend; the 4th Annual Shirkey Electric Par 3 Golf Outing takes place June 25th at 9:00 a.m. with the grand prize being a 2023 season membership to the Marysville Golf Course; the city park looks beautiful and was amazing last weekend with all the people having events.

Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman mentioned the nice attendance in the park for the car show and little league event; gave her condolences to the Osentoski family; condolences to Terry Collins family and also to Shawn's uncle.

City Manager Randy Fernandez will be showing three projects along the waterfront to SEMCOG officials on June 14th; Morton Elementary first grade classes will do a walk-through at city hall on Tuesday and St. Clair County Community College will celebrate Juneteenth on Saturday, June 18th from 12-4 p.m. with many activities.

Mayor Pyden read a thank you note from the high school principal for the participation of student government day; mentioned Lauzon, LeVey and Williams as graduates from a fire training; Scouts BSA Troop #216 will pick up flags Tuesday evening; training with the rescue boat in the water went very well; concrete is being replaced at the Public Safety building; inquired on return date for the fire truck; stated the city park looked outstanding last weekend and presented Council Member Barber with happy birthday cupcakes.
