- A. Moved by Council Member Wessel, supported by Council Member Badley to approve check disbursements from July 8, 2022 and July 15, 2022. Motion passed unanimously.
- B. Moved by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman, supported by Council Member Badley to approve electronic disbursements and payment to Shirkey Electric in the amount of \$14,130.28 for work at the park, Recreation, City Hall and Waste Water Plant. - C. Moved by Council Member Badley, supported by Council Member Wessel to approve payroll for August 5, 2022. Motion passed unanimously.

FOLLOW UP BUSINESS:

- A. Mayor Pyden commented on the River Road speed bumps; stated signs are not allowed on public right of way; inquired about the demolition of small white building on Huron Blvd. and the plans to proceed with a new amphitheater. Administration responded.

MAYOR & COUNCIL/MANAGER COMMENTS:

Council Member Wessel received feedback from residents at the south end of River Rd. regarding speed bumps. Administration responded. He also mentioned the Cliff Erickson concert in the park at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday night.

Council Member Barber thanked Duke Dunn and Ken Cummings for attending the meeting and educating residents on the millage, he has the upmost respect for both of them.

Council Member Shirkey reminded people to get out and vote.

Council Member Badley thanked Mr. Dunn and Mr. Cummings for attending the meeting and he fully supports both of the proposals on the ballot.

Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman thanked Mr. Cummings and Mr. Dunn and she also supports the proposals; encouraged people to get out and vote; good job to the DPW staff with the cross-walk painting and she feels the speed bumps are very effective.

City Manager Randy Fernandez mentioned voting on Tuesday, August 2nd and he is also a supporter of the Parks and Recreation Millage. He announced that Marysville and all non-profit organizations are eligible to fill out a one-page application to apply for a Community Foundation Grant.

Mayor Pyden thanked Mr. Cummings and Mr. Dunn for attending the meeting and explaining the millages.

City Clerk Rene' Stoia presented information on the Primary Election, precinct locations in Marysville and absentee voting.
