COMMUNICATIONS/PRESENTATIONS:

- A. Mayor Pyden presented Kraig Hohf a Resolution of Appreciation for his years of service with the City of Marysville.
- B. Police and Fire new hires and promotions were introduced by Public Safety Chief Tom Konik. They consist of Thomas Williams – school resource officer, Jared Jemison – patrolman, Aaron Thomas – promoted to fire captain, Tyler Giraud – part time to full time firefighter and Chris Kovach – full time firefighter.

- A. J. Quinlan, 195 Sandpiper thanked the city for the completion of the pickleball court. He appreciates that city council has a plan, get together and get things done.
- B. T. Whiting, 1030 River Rd. expressed that 80% to 90% of traffic has slowed down on River Road due to the speed bumps and would like a speed bump placed closer to the curve. He also suggested organizing a traffic safety committee.

- C. Moved by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman, supported by Council Member Badley to approve payroll for September 2, 2022. Motion passed unanimously.
- D. Moved by Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman, supported by Council Member Winston to approve the quote amount of \$40,000.00 from HESCO of Novi, MI for a water filtration plant 24" Dynamic Coagulant Flash Mixer. Motion passed unanimously.

## FOLLOW UP BUSINESS:

- A. Council Member Barber stated a contractor will repair the Gratiot Blvd. bike path with concrete this week. Announced a round table workshop is scheduled for September 19<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. at the Community Center to discuss the museum and bandshell. He feels credit should be given to city administration and thanked tax payers for making the school resource position happen.
- B. Mayor Pyden spoke of the speed bumps being experimental and inquired on road holes when they are removed for the winter. Administration responded.

Council Member Winston wished Kraig Hohf a happy retirement; appreciates the introduction of new employees and mentioned Hot Wheels on Friday and Saturday.
