- B. Council Member Barber announced the September 19th round table discussion at Marysville Community Center from 7:00 – 8:30 p.m. Residents may voice their opinions on what should be done with the band shell and museum.

MAYOR & COUNCIL/MANAGER COMMENTS:

Council Member Barber heard the weather was great for Hot Wheels Weekend, however, he and wife Karen were in Scotland at that time. He also encouraged residents to attend the September 19th meeting.

Council Member Shirkey thanked everyone who attended the meeting tonight, it is nice to hear positive comments.

Mayor Pro-Tem Hayman thanked all the guests in attendance, it is nice to hear from them. She spoke of the Marysville Community Endowment Fund. You can make contributions and they go toward the betterment of the community. On Friday night at the Marysville football game, members of the Community Endowment Fund will be granting \$23K to Marysville nonprofits and organizations in the community.

City Manager Randy Fernandez stated that the Recreation Department and Public Safety will be awarded funds from the Community Endowment Fund; thanked County Commission Duke Dunn for the \$420K the city received which will be used toward the band shell improvements and thanked all public safety employees who participated in the 911 exercise.

Mayor Pyden said a fine job was done at the 911 exercise; said there's an event at Ocean Breeze that provides funds for the Firemen's Memorial in Roscommon and would like to see city and community events posted on the city website.
