GUIDELINES FOR FIRE DRILLS IN DAY CARE HOMES

- 1. Plan two escape routes from each room of the home; one the normal exit, and the other a different door or window.
- 2. Write out your escape plan and rehearse it monthly.
- 3. Activate smoke detectors so children become adjusted to the sound and respond accordingly.
- 4. Teach children that they SHOULD NOT hide under beds or in closets.
- Imagine the room is filled with smoke. Children and adults should practice crawling low.
- 6. Close doors against smoke and heat. If door is closed, test it before opening by feeling near the top. If the door is hot, use the emergency exit.
- 7. Save lives instead of property. In a fire situation, evacuate children from the home, and then notify the fire department from a safe location.
- 8. In a multiple-story home, evacuate upper floors first.
- 9. Set a predetermined meeting place outdoors so you know that everyone is safe. This may be at a neighbor's house or yard.
- 10. Teach children to STOP, DROP AND ROLL if their clothing is on fire. Practice regularly.
- 11. Once the building is evacuated, remain outside.
- 12. Evacuation should be completed within three minutes.
