More Middlebury Testing Available

This from Moira Cook at the VDH District Office in Middlebury:

The District just posted two additional COVID-19 testing dates in Middlebury for September. The National Guard will run COVID-19 testing clinics on September 3 and 10 at the American Legion Post #27 (49 Wilson Road). The clinics will run from 9am – 3pm. National Guard clinics can accommodate 200 appointments per day with additional capacity for walk-ins. The National Guard will likely continue to host Thursday clinics through September. We are hoping to finalize plans for additional September National Guard clinics next week.

The Health Department Middlebury office will continue to host COVID-19 clinics every Tuesday from 9am – 3pm at their building at 156 South Village Green. Their clinics have 100 appointments per day.
