**Okay, So When Can We Get Our Vaccinations?**

A recurring question as of late. The latest information is that the vaccine will not be available generally until late spring. There is no process right now to “sign up”. The group 1-A vaccines are on-going now, but the supply coming to Vermont is sluggish and behind what VDH hoped for. Pharmacies have a contract to vaccinate high-risk people in long term care and nursing home facilities. That is underway as well.

The next group once 1-A is complete are those 75 years old and older Then will come age 70 and up, then age 65 and up. Healthcare providers for those in those age groups should be notifying their patients when and where they can get the vaccine. Once these are done vaccinations will be open to the general public. Timing right now is dependent on the supply. Currently, only the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines (requiring 2 doses 28 days apart) are here. Once Johnson and Johnson (requires 1 dose) and AstraZeneca vaccines are on line things will speed up.
