BIPOC Vaccination Clinic in Middlebury Wednesday

The Rutland Area NAACP has organized a BIPOC-specific vaccine clinic in Middlebury on April 28 from 4pm- 6 pm. Registration for this one is through the State of Vermont – you can call **855-722-7878**, or do it through the Department of Health website at <https://www.healthvermont.gov/covid-19/vaccine/getting-covid-19-vaccine> (you will need to create an account if you don't have one). In either case, you **must identify yourself as BIPOC (or living in a household with BIPOC) to access this clinic.**

This clinic is open to BIPOC Middlebury College students, faculty, and staff (and households, including roommates/housemates), as well as the wider community.

Johnson & Johnson Vaccine Resumes

Vermont will resume use of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine the week of April 26. Vermonters age 18 and older can now sign up for clinics that will offer the single-dose Johnson & Johnson vaccine. To register for an appointment or change one you already have, go to <https://www.healthvermont.gov/covid-19/vaccine/getting-covid-19-vaccine> click on "Make An Appointment" or call **855-722-7878**. Certain participating pharmacy partners, including [CVS](#) and [Walgreens](#), are making plans to also offer Johnson & Johnson vaccine. You can contact those pharmacies directly to make an appointment or reschedule.
