Vax for 12-15 Year Olds Coming Soon

The CDC is expected to announce tomorrow that the Pfizer vaccine will be approved for 12-15 year olds. If the vaccine is approved, registration will be expected to open Thursday morning, May 13, at 8:15 a.m. This reflects Vermont's maximum effort to knock this virus down and get to the business of opening everything up!

You can register for a vaccine for this Saturday at a mobile clinic being held at the Granville Fire Department. On May 21-23, EMS agencies throughout the state will be opening for walk-ins. There are supposed to be 30 of these sites throughout the state. An announcement will be made later this week on locations.

Getting There- June is Coming Early This Year

Vermont is closing in on the June 1st target for total vaccinations, 377,800 have received their shots, most have completed their shots. The June 1st target of 60% of the population vaccinated was hit today, 22 days ahead of schedule.

Preparing the bulletins these days is encouraging and even joyful, as opposed to the dire prose we were putting out last year and early this year. The Governor is prepared to accelerate the Vermont Forward Plan to Step 3, expect an announcement this Friday. There is even a hope, if vaccinations proceed as they are, that the final step may come prior to the July 4 target date.
