Stay Tuned for Friday

The Governor announced today that on Friday he will unveil:

- a schedule for the opening up of indoor dining
- allowance for out-of-staters to visit Vermont (from certain states/regions within states) without the need for quarantine – this is to stimulate business
- ways to increase capacity, recognizing that limits on capacity at businesses and campgrounds are insufficient to maintain the business.

The “Hot Chocolate” shack will be removed, access direction will be provided by passive signage and pre-registration instructions.

Still Need Food?

A food bank event will be held Wednesday, June 10, from 10-2 in Addison County. The location has not yet been announced. It will be run much different than prior events. It will not be first come first served and you need to be registered. Registration is done through 2-1-1. You will be provided a time range and location for which to pick up food. The event is run through the State Emergency Operations Center and staffed by the Vermont National Guard.
