As things become somewhat static, and new information from State agencies diminishes, we'll move to publish this bulletin thrice weekly to follow the Governor's conferences. Other than the Winooski outbreak, infections statewide have been increasing ever so slowly, no one is hospitalized right now. The emergency order remains in effect through July 15, and preventative actions are still the best way to stymie an outbreak. Local municipal services are operating at normal staffing and service levels. If we can keep the rate of infection low, we can hold off a medical crisis while effective remedies and vaccines are developed. We hope the worst is over.
