

SEPTEMBER 20, 2021

The Monett City Council met in regular session, Monday, September 20, 2021, at 9:30 a.m. at the Monett Park Casino, Highway 37 and 60, Monett, Missouri. Attendance was as follows: Mike Brownsberger – Mayor, Al Dohmen – Commissioner, Ken Gaspar – Commissioner, Christopher Weiner – City Administrator, Kristen Thompson – Deputy City Clerk, Kelley McMillan – Administrative Specialist, Georges Daoud – Police Chief, and three citizens.

Mayor Brownsberger called the meeting to order. The Minutes from the previous sessions dated August 20, 2021, August 27th, and August 31st were approved with a motion from Commissioner Dohmen and a second from Commissioner Gaspar. The following vote was recorded: Brownsberger – yes, Dohmen – yes, and Gaspar – yes.

Monthly expenditures in the amount of \$1,922,146.11 were presented for approval. Commissioner Dohmen made a motion to approve the expenses, and a second was heard from Commissioner Gaspar. The following vote was recorded: Brownsberger – yes, Dohmen – yes, and Gaspar – yes.

Approval of Grant Agreement from the FAA in the amount of \$16,054,454 for Paving of the Airport Runway. A discussion was led by Chris Weiner – City Administrator stating paving is proposed for next spring, since groundwork is not ready. Commissioner Gaspar made the motion to approve the Grant and a second from Commissioner Dohmen. The following vote was recorded: Brownsberger – yes, Dohmen – yes, and Gaspar – yes.

BILL 8880: FIRST READING OF BILL 8880 TO OPEN CALE, DUNN, AND LINDEN STREETS FOR TWO-WAY TRAFFIC.

First and Second reading of Bill 8880 to open Cale and Dunn Streets from Eisenhower to Linden Streets, and Linden Street between Cale and Dunn for Two-Way Traffic. No discussion was heard from the public. After second reading of Bill 8880 a motion to approve Bill 8880 as Ordinance 8880 was made by Commissioner Dohmen and seconded by Commissioner Gaspar. The following vote was recorded: Brownsberger – yes, Dohmen – yes, Gaspar – yes.

BILL 8881: ALLOWING FOR THE TRANSPORT AND EXHIBITION OF “WILD ANIMALS”

First reading of Bill 8881. Chris Weiner explained this would cover for example when a circus comes to town. Second reading was tabled for October session.

RESOLUTION 8882: A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE PROPOSED MONETT HOMES (RED-WOOD DEVELOPMENT), L.P. SINGLE- FAMILY AFFORDABLE HOUSING DEVELOPMENT PROJECT.

Resolution 8882 was presented for approval and a motion to approve “Red-Wood Development” was made by Commissioner Dohmen and seconded by Commissioner Gaspar. The following vote was recorded: Brownsberger – yes, Dohmen – yes, Gaspar – yes.

RESOLUTION 8883: A RESOLUTION TO RE-APPOINT AND CONFIRM MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS FOR THE MONETT MARKETPLACE COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT.

Resolution 8883 was presented for the re-appointment and confirmation of Leigh Babbit-Bekebrede, Kerry Rovig, and Tyler Creach as Member of the Board of Directors for the Monett Marketplace Community Improvement District. City Administrator Chris Weiner explained this is the governing body for the property between Lowe’s and Freedom Community Bank. Mayor Brownsberger motioned to approve and second by Commissioner Dohmen. The following vote was recorded: Brownsberger – yes, Dohmen – yes, Gaspar – yes.

RESOLUTION 8884: A RESOLUTION FOR APPOINTMENT OF THE CITY OF MONETT’S EMPLOYER DELEGATE FOR LAGERS.

Resolution 8884 was presented to appoint Kristen Thompson as the City of Monett’s delegate for LAGERS annual meeting October 14 – 15th. Motion was made for approval by Commissioner Gaspar and seconded by Commissioner Dohmen. The following vote was recorded: Brownsberger – yes, Dohmen – yes, Gaspar – yes.

Upon conclusion of regular business, Christopher Weiner, City Administrator, requested a time be set for a work session. It was agreed upon the work session to be held on Tuesday, September 28th, 2021, at 9:30 a.m. at City Hall.

Having no further business, the meeting was adjourned with a motion from Commissioner Gaspar, and a second from Commissioner Dohmen. The following vote was recorded: Brownsberger – yes, Dohmen – yes, Gaspar – yes.
