During a recent meeting of Town Board, several updates were offered concerning transportation projects taking place around Mooreville:

- * West Wilson Avenue, as well as the pedestrian improvements from U.S. 21 to Broad Street, will start construction in the first quarter of 2021. The project will include new curbs and pedestrian paths, including pedestrian bridge along West Wilson Avenue. Two traffic signals will be added to Academy Street and Lowrance Avenue.
- * The Moore Avenue Pedestrian Improvement Project, which will provide safety and accessibility improvements from Academy Street (which includes Mitchell Community College) to Liberty Park, was awarded \$1.2 million in CRTPO funding.
- * The Town of Mooreville was awarded \$60,000 in CRTPO funding to create a plan for easing traffic flow in the Downtown area.
- * The East-West connector was awarded a \$13.8 million BUILD grant and design work is underway, with construction beginning in 2022. The East-West connector is a multi-lane road project that will connect Langtree Road to N.C. Highway 115, and includes both road improvements at the Langtree Road and East West Connector intersection and the N.C. Highway 115 and East West Connector intersection.

Special Collections renamed

The Mooresville Public Library’s Special Collections will be rebranded in 2021, and will be known as Local History and Archives, a name that Andy Poore, Curator, says “more accurately reflects and explains what we do.”

The Local History and Archives section of the library encompasses Mooresville and Iredell County history, including photographs, maps, rare books, genealogy, oral histories, and more. Along with the name change is a push to put more items online, so that residents can have better access to materials at home.

“We’re really focusing on our tagline, ‘Making the Past Present,’ with our new web catalog and boosting what’s available digitally for our residents,” said Poore. “With two new employees now assisting in Local History and Archives, we were able to put more out there than ever for our patrons to access.”
