Getting to know your Town facilities

We're highlighting Town facilities to give residents a better idea of what's available right here! This month we're focusing on the Mooreville Golf Club.

The Mooreville Golf Club, located at 205 Golf Course Drive, was originally a nine-hole course designed by Donald Ross for exclusive use by Burlington Mill employees. The course transitioned to Town ownership in the mid-70s and was known as the Mooreville Municipal Golf Course.



It expanded in 1978, adding the back nine holes to the course. The course's design remained unchanged until 2014, when recreation bonds were used to renovate the course and its new name, Mooreville Golf Club, was put in place. The current course features a layout with a links-style golf experience. Additionally, the clubhouse includes a restaurant, snack bar & grill, pro shop, outdoor seating and garage facility.

The Mooreville Golf Club has remained busy despite the pandemic, with more than 40,000 rounds of golf played last fiscal year, and already, almost 38,000 rounds have been played this fiscal year. In 2021, 49 tournaments are on the books, and the driving range is very active, with almost 18,000 buckets of balls sold. The Golf Club is open to the public, and tee times can be booked using moorevillegolfclub.com. For more information, call 704-663-2539.
