


Classic Christmas celebration set for December

Holiday safety starts at home Making sure your family's celebration is a success



Decorations like trees, lights and candles can increase the risk of home fires during the holidays, and unfortunately, Christmas, New Year's Eve, and New Year's Day are the top three days for home candle fires, according to the National Fire Protection Association. Below are some tips to keep your family safer this season:


- Check all your holiday light cords to insure they aren't frayed or broken.
- · If you are buying an artificial tree, look for the fire-resistant label, and keep it away from fireplaces, radiators, and other sources of heat.
- If you're getting a live tree, make sure it's fresh and water it consistently.
- If you decorate outside your home, make sure your decorations are for outdoor use and fasten lights securely to your home or trees.
- Don't forget to turn off all lights when going to bed or leaving the house.

Safe Travels While Out of Town

Traveling by car during the holidays has the highest fatality rate of any major form of transportation, based on fatalities per passenger mile. Alcohol impairment is involved in about a third of those fatalities. Stay safe on the roads by following these tips:

- Prepare your car for winter and keep an emergency preparedness kit handy.
- Get a good night's sleep before departing and avoid drowsy driving.
- Leave early and plan ahead for heavy traffic and delays.
- Make sure every person in the vehicle is properly buckled up, no matter how long or short the distance traveled.
- Many distractions can occur while driving, but cell phones are a main culprit. Put your phone away while you are behind the wheel.
- · Practice defensive driving.
- Designate a sober driver to ensure guests make it home safely after a party.



Redistricting in Mooresville

The Town of Mooresville's Board of Commissioners held a public hearing on Nov. 15 at their regularly scheduled meeting to gain insight from residents about their redistricting preference.

Redistricting is the regular process of adjusting the lines of voting districts in accordance with population shifts. To ensure a +/-5% deviation in population for each ward, the Town is working with an outside vendor to reshape the current ward boundaries.

During the public hearing, two options were presented, Option A and Option 2A, and the board voted to choose Option 2A. Residents may visit https://arcg.is/1TWKuK to look at the redistricting map that the board chose in order to check their ward.
