Adopt-A-Drain Program Kicks Off



The Town of Mooresville's Adopt-A-Drain program was created by our Stormwater Department as an opportunity for residents to help improve water quality and decrease localized flooding. Participants in the Adopt-A-Drain Program make a one-year commitment to act as a steward for a storm drain in their community.

Participants can visit https://bit.ly/3rlpTOz and use the interactive map on the site to find a storm drain in your neighborhood, near work, or along your favorite walking route. To join the program, send a photo of the available storm drain(s) and all required and completed documentation to the Adopt-A-Drain Program Coordinator. Once approved, you'll receive a Personal Protective Equipment kit to safely clear debris from your adopted storm drain(s). Then, you can utilize the Adoptable Drains map to send your observations to the Town of Mooresville Stormwater staff in real time!

Once a part of the program, you are expected to regularly monitor the drain to ensure it is clear of debris and trash and report observations at least once a month. Participants will also receive occasional reminders from the Town of Mooresville Stormwater staff when heavy rain is forecasted to check their drains are free of debris to minimize pollutants that enter the system and prevent localized flooding.


East/West Connector Signing

Ceremony officially kicked off longtime project





Stakeholders from The Cove Church, Inc., G&M Partners LLC, Langtree Development Co. LLC, and W.C. Bradley Real Estate Investments, LLC gathered at Cove Church to ceremonially sign over contributions and/or land right-of-way for Phase I of the East/West Connector project, which totaled \$7.6 million. Once completed, Phase I will be an economic driver for development in the southeast quadrant of Interstate 77 and Langtree Road for years to come.
